1. Opening of the session

(a) Statement by the outgoing President of the Executive Board

(b) Election of the President and Vice-Presidents of the Executive Board for 2009

The President and Vice-Presidents of the Executive Board represent the regional groups of the United Nations Member States. In accordance with the rotation scheme established by the Executive Board in its decision 1992/7 (E/ICEF/1992/14), the 2009 President will be nominated from among the Group of African States that are members of the Executive Board.

2. Adoption of the provisional annotated agenda, timetable and organization of work

For action [E/ICEF/2009/1]

The provisional agenda has been drafted in consultation with the Bureau of the Executive Board based on the 2009 programme of work adopted by the Executive Board in the 2008 second regular session. The Executive Board will adopt the agenda for the session, making any amendments it considers necessary.

Programme and policy matters

3. Annual report to the Economic and Social Council

For action [E/ICEF/2009/3]; for information [E/ICEF/2009/6]

This report annually complies with General Assembly resolution 59/250 of 2004 on the triennial comprehensive policy review (TCPRI) of operational activities for development of the United Nations system, and is in accordance with the request from Member States, and with recommendations of General Assembly resolution 62/208 of 2007 on the TCPRI, for greater harmonization and coordination. The report provides information about the direction UNICEF is taking to work in closer partnership with other members of the United Nations system to ensure that development assistance produces sustainable results for children. The Executive Board may wish to take note of the report and transmit it, together with the comments made by delegations at the present session, to the Economic and Social Council at its substantive session of 2009.

Under this agenda item, the Executive Board will also consider a note by the secretariat on recent reports of the Joint Inspection Unit (JIU) that are of relevance to UNICEF.

4. Follow-up to the evaluation of gender policy implementation*For discussion [E/ICEF/2009/4]*

UNICEF commissioned a global evaluation of its gender policy in March 2007. The report was made available in March 2008. The Executive Board received in the 2008 annual session a conference room paper summarizing the key findings and proposed follow-up action. The Executive Board in its decision 2008/10 requested UNICEF to present to the 2009 first regular session a management response to all recommendations of the evaluation of gender policy implementation in UNICEF, including actions and time frames for completion. The report also includes a tracking and monitoring framework developed to measure progress in implementation.

5. UNICEF programme cooperation**(a) Approval of revised country programme documents discussed at the second regular session of 2008***For action*

At the second regular session of 2008, the Executive Board discussed six draft CPDs for full programme cycles (Angola, Kenya, Côte d'Ivoire, Haiti, Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela and Timor-Leste). The comments made were shared with the respective country offices and the draft country programme documents were revised as appropriate. The revised country programme documents were posted on the UNICEF website within six weeks after the session. The Executive Board will approve the country programme documents on a no-objection basis unless at least five members have informed the secretariat in writing that they wish to bring a particular country programme to the Executive Board for further discussion.

(b) Recommendation for approval of additional regular resources for approved country programmes*For action [E/ICEF/2009/P/L.1]*

As a result of the application of the modified system for allocation of regular resources, including the Executive Board's decision 2008/15 to increase the minimum annual level of regular resource allocations and as a function of the estimated global regular resources available for programmes in 2009, the regular resources planning levels for 30 countries listed in the table are higher than the regular resources levels originally approved by the Executive Board. The Executive Board is being requested to approve the additional regular resources to allow uninterrupted implementation of the country programmes previously approved.

Resource, financial and budgetary matters**6. UNICEF financial report and audited financial statements for the biennium ended 31 December 2007 and Report of the Board of Auditors***For information [A/63/5/Add.2 and A/63/5/Add.2/Corr.1]*

The UNICEF financial report and audited financial statements and Report of the Board of Auditors on the UNICEF financial report and statements are presented to the Executive Board every two years. The report is presented at the first regular session so that the Executive Board may take into account any comments made by

the Fifth Committee on the report during the sixty-third session of the General Assembly.¹ In addition, the following two related reports will be made available to the Executive Board for information: (a) Implementation of the recommendations of the Board of Auditors contained in its reports on the United Nations funds and programmes for the financial period ended 31 December 2007 — Report of the Secretary-General (A/63/327/Add.1); and (b) Financial reports and audited financial statements and reports of the Board of Auditors for the period ended 31 December 2007 — Report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/63/474).

7. Private Fundraising: 2009 work plan and proposed budget

The report covers the work plan and proposed budget for 2009 for private fundraising activities. The document includes draft decisions submitted to the Executive Board for approval.

8. Pledging event

As part of the UNICEF resource mobilization strategy (decision 1999/8), during the pledging event, which is held at the first regular session each year, Governments in a position to do so will announce their voluntary contributions to UNICEF regular resources for 2009, together with firm or indicative commitments for future years.
