On the edge of Kinshasa in the Democratic Republic of Congo, the Biamba Marie Mutombo hospital offers hope.

A state of the art medical facility founded in 2007 by basketball legend Dikembe Mutombo, the hospital provides healthcare in a country where the medical system has largely collapsed.

SOUNDBITE (French): Niki Kasu, mother: “The healthcare here is really [good] quality. The medicines they give to the sick are first-rate, they are made in good quality pharmacies.”

This week, at a ceremony attended by Mutombo and UNICEF Executive Director Ann M. Veneman, Mutombo hospital launched two new Centers to improve treatment of patients with HIV/AIDS.

SOUNDBITE (English) Ann M.Veneman, UNICEF Executive Director: “This Hospital is an example of what a health care system could look like, if it were properly implemented throughout the country. And could help to save so many lives, whether it’s the children who are dying of largely preventable causes – over half a million children die here every year, who are under the age of 5, of largely preventable causes, like malaria and diahrea and pneumonia, and malnutrition – it shouldn’t happen.”

With the help of the American-based medical technology company Becton, Dickinson (BD) the hospital’s staff will receive a range of safety-engineered injection blood collection devices as well as laboratory and occupational safety training.

And the legendary Congo-born athlete who made it possible is not stopping yet:

“The maternal mortality in this country is very high. You have a 1 in 13 chance of dying of maternal related causes. That compares to 1 in 8000 in the developed world. And so the risks to being a mother, or being a child are very high here – and with preventative health care those risks could be declined significantly. And so a health care centre like this shines as an example of what needs to be done in this country.”
