The American pop singer spent five days travelling from the capital city of Kabul to Bamyan in the central region of the country.

He paid a visit to the UNICEF supported Sadat Health Clinic.

Here Mr. Aiken gave a polio vaccination to a young child and met with many mothers.

The facility provides a much needed life line for nearby communities.

Not only does it offer immunization services for newborn babies, but also teaches family planning like best breastfeeding and hygiene practices.
