Sanjay Reddy is currently a Laurance S. Rockefeller Visiting Fellow at the Center for Human Values at Princeton University, and is an Assistant Professor of Economics at Barnard College in New York. He received his PhD from Harvard University in 2000, and has proved himself to be one of the more promising economists in the fields of global poverty and inequality measurement. Dr. Reddy also holds an M.Phil in social anthropology from Cambridge University and an A.B. in applied mathematics with physics from Harvard University. Other areas of work include international economics, economics and philosophy, and economics of social theory.

Dr. Reddy has been an advisor to the Carnegie Council's Justice and the World Economy program and is a member of the editorial boards of a number of academic journals, including *Ethics & International Affairs*. He is a former fellow of the Center for Ethics and the Professions at Harvard University and a Bell Fellow at the Center for Population and Development Studies. Dr. Reddy has worked extensively as a consultant for numerous development agencies and international institutions, including the ILO, OXFAM, UNICEF, UNDP, UNU-WIDER, and the World Bank, and was on the advisory board of the United Nations Development Programme's *Human Development Report*.
