

Evaluation Criteria for Project Proposals

Submitted project proposals will be evaluated on the basis of the following criteria:

- **Evidence base** - applicants must include the problem analysis, the effectiveness and applicability of the proposed actions;
- **Content** - applicants must clearly describe the goals and objectives, target groups and beneficiaries and also the expected results proposing low threshold services that demonstrate high accessibility and flexibility and/or activities contributing to the development of services listed in the [Call for Proposals](#) as *funding priorities*.
- **Technical capacity** - The applicants must demonstrate experience for implementing the proposed activities/services. The applicants must have experience in managing projects/programs with funding from international donors. Previous experience in implementing projects with funding from UN and/or Global Fund for Fighting AIDS, TB and Malaria is an asset. The applicant must prove the professional resources, competences and qualifications of the proposed project team by supplying their curriculum vitae.
- **Budget** - applicants must ensure that budget be relevant, appropriate, balanced and consistent in itself and with the specific objectives of the project. The budget must be prepared in US\$. The proposed projects must comply with two principles: co-financing (the proposal must feature co-financing or in-kind contributions by your NGO from another source) and no-profit (the grant may not have the purpose or effect of producing a profit for the beneficiary).

Weightings of above criteria are the following:

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| Evidence base | . 10 |
| Content | . 30 |
| Technical capacity | . 30 |
| Budget | . 30 |

Maximum **100**

Following the evaluation process, proposals will be recommended for funding according to the total marks awarded. The remaining proposals recommended for funding will be placed on a reserve list depending on budget availability.
