

KEY FACTS

- Around 67% of children aged 2 to 14 experience physical or psychological punishment
- This rises to 86% of children in Roma settlements and to 90 per cent of Roma children aged 5 to 9
- An estimated 37% of young school children report peer violence, rising to 55% in higher grades
- Around 65% of school pupils have experienced violence at least once, and 22% report frequent peer violence.
- Around 3% of women believe their partner has a right to hit them, but this rises to 20% of women in Roma settlements.
