UNICEF is working with health authorities to introduce cost-effective ways to reduce both maternal and infant mortality.

Only 55-per-cent of Kyrgyzstan's hospitals and clinics are certified as 'baby friendly'.

The death of a new born or a mother that could be prevented is a tragedy in every Kyrgyz community.

However, new equipment and training is beginning making a difference.

New health policies now enable pregnant women to receive free medical care throughout their pregnancy and for their children up to the age of five.

Gradually, Kyrgyzstan's health system is developing the capacity to provide a more holistic approach to maternal and infant care.
