The response to the tsunami and the lessons learned have changed the way UNICEF deals with such emergencies. It highlighted the need for better coordination among partners and other organizations. It also underscored the need for and contributed to reforms in the way humanitarian relief is administered and delivered.

UNICEF and its partners were already active in many of the countries affected. They were there when the tsunami struck. And UNICEF remains committed for the longer term, improving the lives of children and building back better for the future.
