She went to school ... and knows about polio. So does her grandmother, who has seen many disabled by the disease.</p> <p>The village of Sayani is where one of the 12 children who contracted polio last year lives. Two year old Badamasi’s parents missed the last immunization campaign. Now the boy’s father speaks as an advocate of immunization.</p> <p>There are another 66 thousand children under five in the district to be vaccinated ... and more than four million in all of Niger.
