Through her foundation, Imbuto or Seed, First Lady of Rwanda gave out prizes, including bags, books and laptops to the girls who came on top during the latest national exams.

With the highest number of female parliamentarians in the world, Rwanda has made significant strides in promoting girls' education and women's empowerment.

With the Government's commitment, access to basic education is no longer an obstacle, nevertheless, problems still persist when it comes to school completion and enrolment in post-primary institutions for many girls.
