SCRIPT:

Intense fighting between guerilla factions and the Colombian Army since April 14 has displaced more than 6,000 people in the Cauca region of Colombia, including more than 3,000 children.

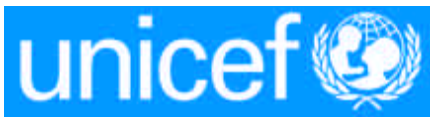
Most of the people affected are Nasa Indians, who are known as a peaceful tribe.

SOUNDBITE (English): JORGE DÍAZ, Nasa Tribal Chief: “There is still a lot of fighting. At night, there were harrassments, and the municipality of Jambaló was seized.

According to U.N. assessment teams, gunfire and mortar rockets destroyed at least 140 homes, and also inflicted damage to churches, hospitals and schools in the area. 10,000 children in the region could not attend school.

SOUNDBITE (English) FLORIXA MESTIZO, Displaced Nasa Child: “We ran away during the shooting because they were going to shoot us with their homemade rockets.”

In response to this humanitarian crisis, a coalition of organisations headed by the United Nations and including UNICEF, is currently assessing damage and coordinating humanitarian assistance for the displaced families, particularly children.



SOUNDBITE (English) – JORGE VALLÉS, UNICEF Humanitarian Action Officer: “First and foremost, we’re concerned with the physical protection of the children, and evaluating and quantifying needs, you might say. At this moment everything is confusing. But we do know that the need is enormous.”

A month after gunfire erupted, the situation continues to be unstable. One of the main concerns is the presence of anti-personnel mines and unexploded munitions scattered in the area. To address this problem, UNICEF will start a campaign to educate civilians about the potential risks.

But until the fighting stops, the zone will likely remain volatile and dangerous for Nasa families.
