

**Script**

In her first visit to the Occupied Palestinian Territory UNICEF goodwill ambassador Mia Farrow met families in Gaza who are coping with the after-effects of January's conflict.

Nearly three hundred schools were damaged during the fighting and many cannot be repaired because of the ongoing blockade. Omar Bin Al Khattab School operates on a double shift, to accommodate students who have nowhere to study.

Ms Farrow was joined by fellow Goodwill Ambassador and award winning Egyptian actor Mahmoud Kabil. They visited Gaza's Artificial Limb Centre which is struggling to meet the demand for prosthetic limbs.

In the northern West Bank Ms Farrow met children at a refugee camp in Jenin. And she visited Israeli families who've been affected by incoming rocket fire from Gaza.

"I think the thing I came away with is over whelming. whether it is Gaza or of course the children of Gaza, are the level of fear. The children of Gaza, when the teacher said, look at the sky, there is a loud noise ,scream, and hide , and in Gaza there is no where to them to be safe . Going across to the other side ,the children also , look at the sky with fear, the differences is there places to hide, they do have shelter . The bottom line is that children are afraid in both places.

Here in the occupied territory, here in West Bank, the children are also afraid. I talked to a little boy and he said he wish to he can play like good kids, which absolutely broke my heart, little six years old boy , and he said he had

nothing because his father was in prison, and the house was very clean and the family warm and welcoming lovely people , they had nothing and nothing to put but of course they have each other and he said he wanted to be a doctor.

Everywhere I went the kids in the three areas said they wanted to be a doctor , also some said they wanted to be teachers. It says a lot of when it came to dreams being a doctor for medical care and the moments they have seen in front of their mind , disproportionate number of kids who wanted to become a doctor, with great goals. I just feel with a sense of sorrow and a sense of failure that we as adults in the world failed to protect the children and make them feel safe.”
