### **Recommendation for approval of additional regular resources for approved country programmes**

#### **I. Introduction**

1. The estimated funding target and financial plan contained in the UNICEF medium-term strategic plan (MTSP) for the period 2006-2009 (E/ICEF/2005/11) was approved by the Executive Board at its second regular session of 2005. The MTSP was subsequently extended by the Executive Board until the end of 2013 (Executive Board decisions 2008/14 and 2009/5).
2. Subsequent to the approval of the MTSP, the Executive Board approves on an annual basis the planned financial estimates reflecting the latest projections of income and expenditures. The Executive Board approved the planned financial estimates for the period 2008-2011 at the 2008 second regular session (Executive Board decision 2008/5).
3. Regular resources planning levels for country programmes are established on the basis of the approved planned financial estimates, taking into account the latest projections of income and expenditures, and using the modified system for allocation of regular resources for programmes endorsed by the Executive Board (Executive Board decisions 1997/18 and 2008/15). The regular resources planning levels are posted on the Executive Board website.
4. As a result of the application of the modified system for the allocation of regular resources and global regular resources available for programmes in 2010, the regular resources planning levels for the 29 countries, listed in the table below, are higher than the regular resources levels originally approved by the Executive Board. The Executive Board is therefore requested to approve the additional regular resources for the 29 countries to allow uninterrupted implementation of the country programmes previously approved.

5. The table below sets out for each of the 29 countries:
- (a) The period for which the country programme was approved by the Executive Board;
  - (b) The annual regular resources planning level;
  - (c) The balance of approved regular resources available to the country programme;
  - (d) The amount of additional regular resources for which Executive Board approval is needed to reach the annual planning level for 2010.

## II. Draft decision

6. It is recommended that the Executive Board adopt the following draft decision:

*The Executive Board*

*Recalls* that regular resources planning levels for country programmes are established on the basis of the planned financial estimates approved by the Executive Board on an annual basis, taking into account the latest projections of income and expenditures, and using the modified system for allocation of regular resources for programmes endorsed by the Executive Board (Executive Board decisions 1997/18 and 2008/15);

*Recalls* that regular resources planning levels are posted on the UNICEF Executive Board website;

*Approves* a total of \$186,303,485 in regular resources to fund, for 2010, the approved country programmes of the 29 countries (shown in the table to document E/ICEF/2009/P/L.30) whose regular resources planning levels, based on the modified allocation system and estimated global levels of regular resources available for programmes, are higher than the levels originally approved by the Executive Board.
