Evaluation of the UNICEF Level 3 response to the cholera epidemic in Yemen: crisis within a crisis, and management response

The report presents the findings, conclusions and recommendations of the recently undertaken evaluation of the response to the cholera epidemic in Yemen. The purpose of the evaluation was to inform the UNICEF approach to further potential cholera epidemics in Yemen, based on an analysis of lessons from the response to the 2016–2017 outbreak; to provide some basis for accountability for that response; and to add to the global learning of UNICEF on cholera prevention and response.
