- Prioritizing levels beyond primary
- Targeting the most vulnerable due to data limitations
- Prioritizing education staff and leadership capacity development
- Quality education in protracted crises

Recommendation 1:

Better equip leadership to reflect UNICEF's commitment to education as an essential part of the humanitarian response
