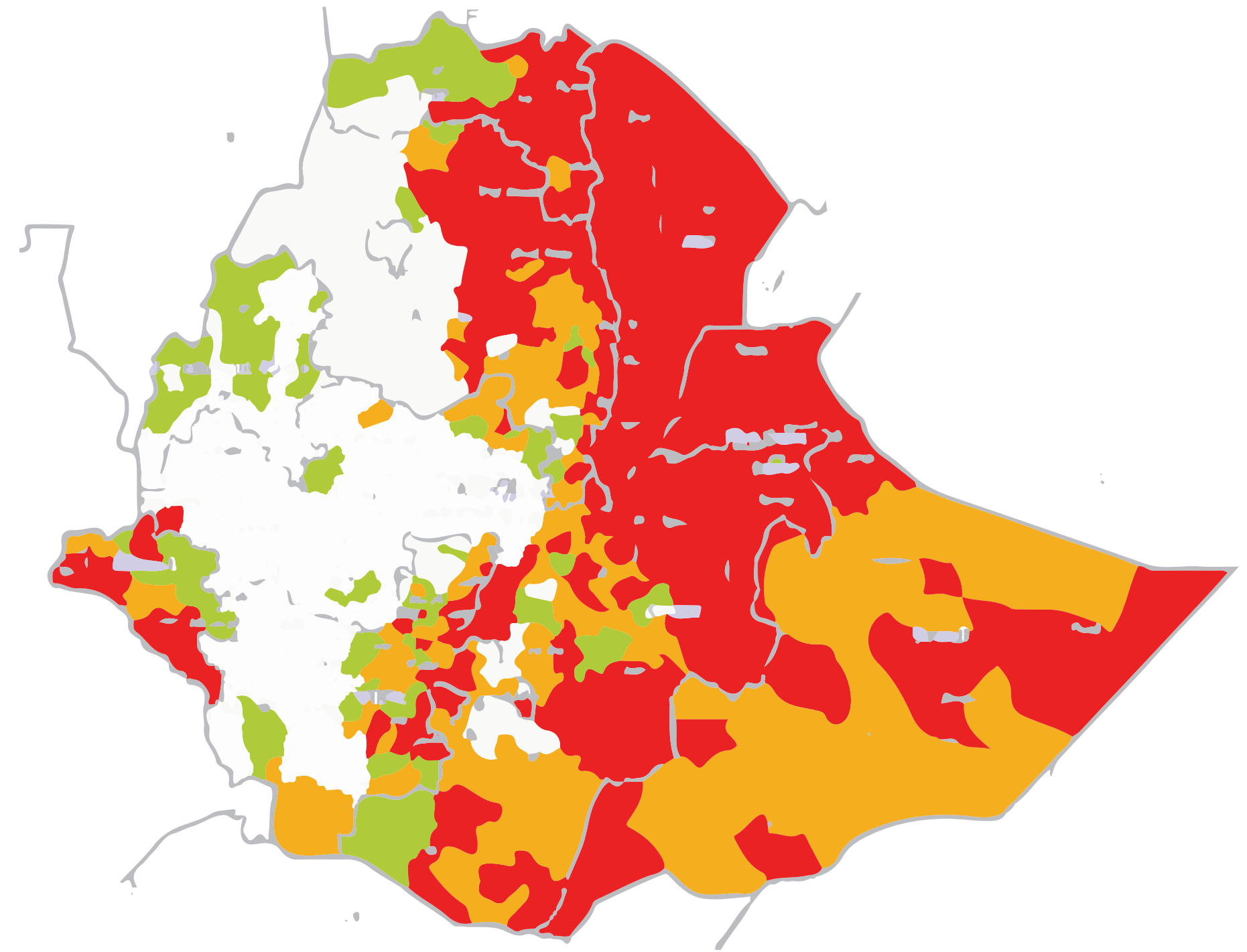


ETHIOPIA: EL Niño DROUGHT HEALTH EMERGENCY

■ First Priority ■ Second priority ■ Third Priority

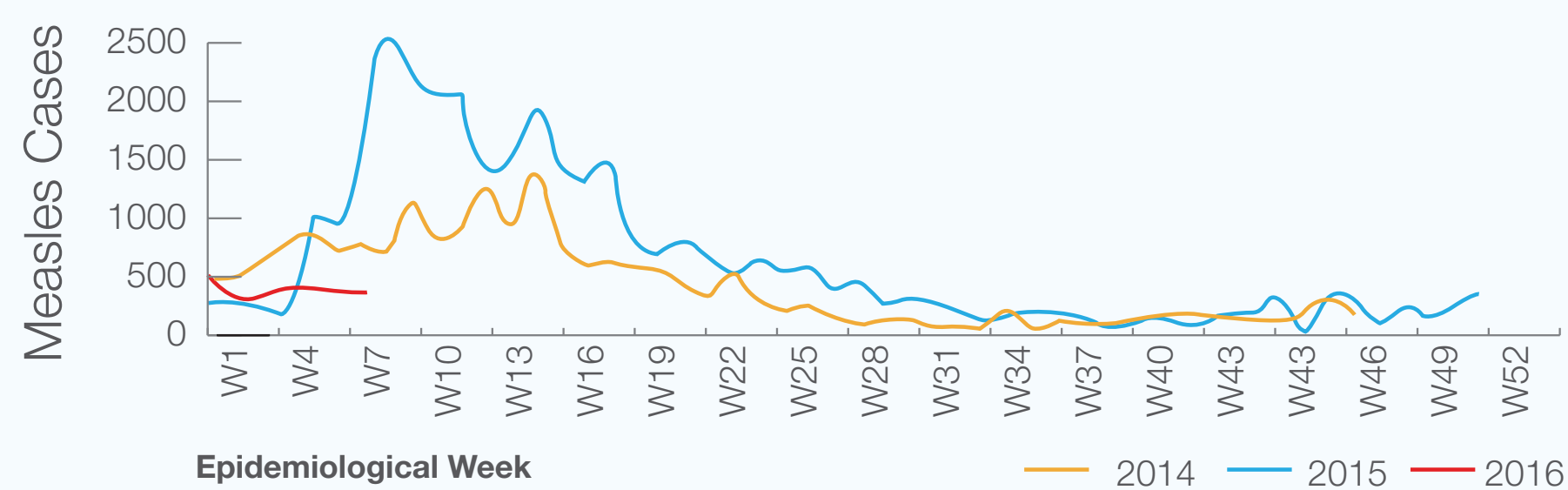
3.6 Million people are in need of emergency health care and disease control activities

10.2 Million people are in need of food assistance

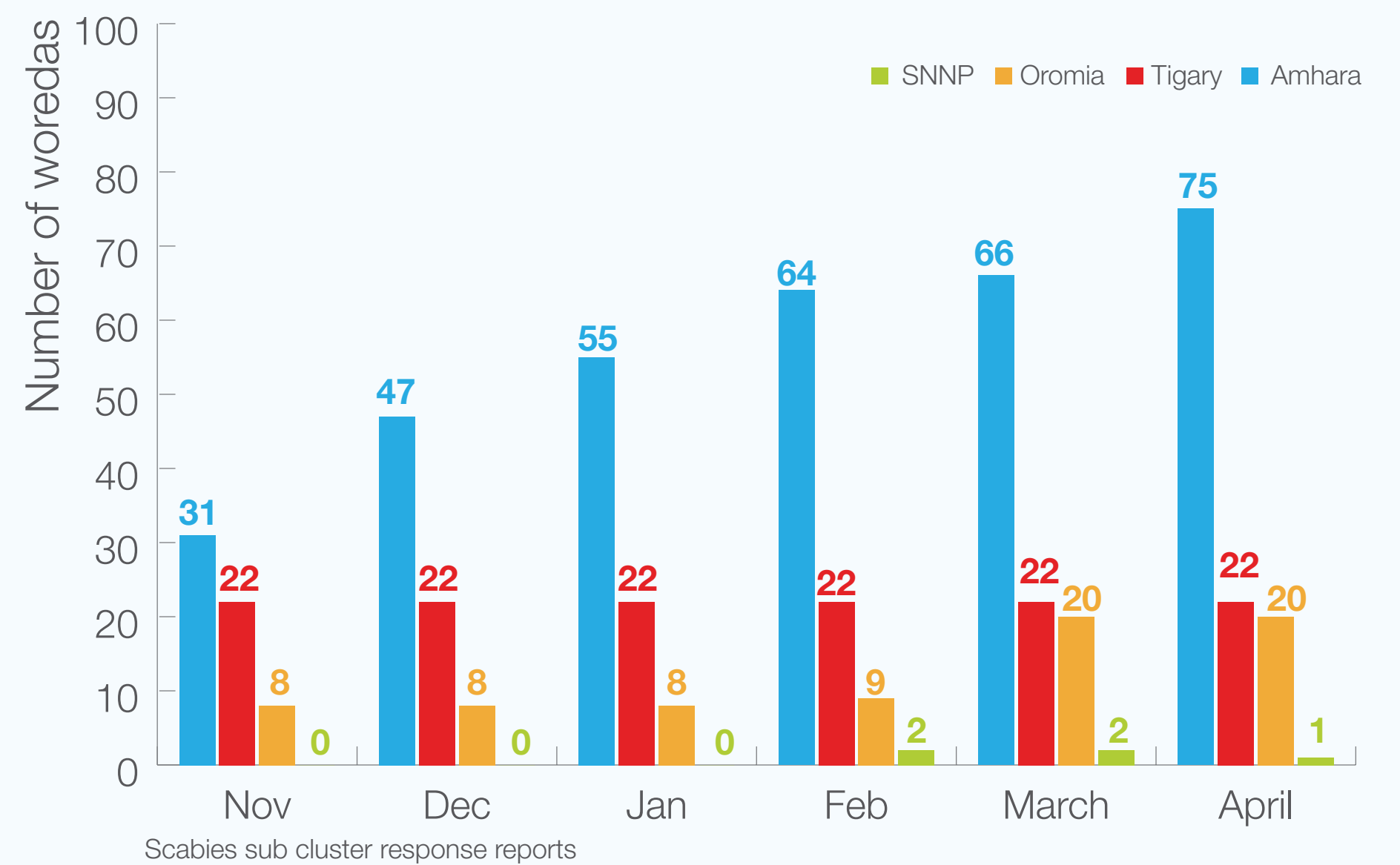
366 A total of woredas are at risk for disease outbreaks (219 hot spot 1 & 147 hot spot 2)

20% of 450,000 children with severe acute malnutrition and 2.2 million children and pregnant and lactating women with moderate acute malnutrition may need health care for complications

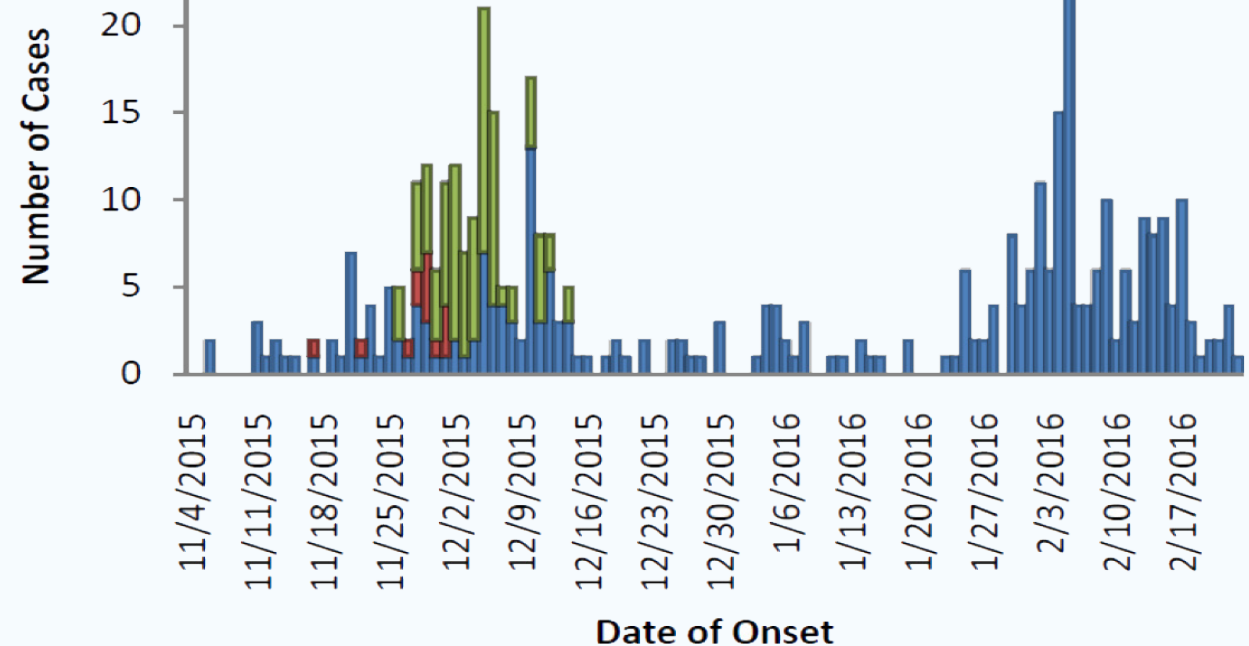
National Suspected Measles Trend 2014-2016

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Response

95% A total of 5.5 million children 6-59 months in hot spot areas were vaccinated with measles



341,267 People benefited from health consultation from 49 mobile health and nutrition teams in Afar and Somali regions which are regularly conducting outreach preventive and curative services

98% 89,440 children and adults aged 2-30 years were vaccinated with meningitis C in refugee camps



719,999 scabies cases and their contacts were provided treatment.



1557 Acute Watery Diarrhea cases (616 in Oromia, 396 in SNNP and 551 in Somali) have been treated through Cholera Treatment Centers established with UNICEF support



Deployed **49** Mobile Health and Nutrition Teams in Afar (20) and Somali regions (29) to reach the pastoralist populations



Distributed **24** Emergency Drug Kits to the prioritized hotspot woredas



Immediately distributed supplies for AWD: 34 Cholera Treatment Centers distributed to regions (Oromia 18, SNNP 8, Somali 4, Tigray 2, AA 2) for scabies: 96720 bottles of permethrin 5% lotion of 100 ml to Amhara, Tigray and Oromia regions



Provided technical support to humanitarian response plan, implementation and multi-sectoral coordination

Way forward

- Improve coordination at all levels
- Mobilize more resources and continued prepositions of essential drugs and supplies
- Train front line Health workers on Rapid Emergency Response
