## **Adolescents and challenges**



#### >1.3 billion

adolescents in the world today

### **12** million

additional girls annually may not be able to complete their education due to impact of climate change

### **1 in 4**

adolescent girls between ages 15-19 are neither employed nor in education/training

# UNICEF vision for adolescent development

A world where adolescents ...

- ...are able to realize the full complement of their rights under the Convention on the Rights of the Child
- ... are empowered to make positive change
- ...safely live, play and work in an enabling and supportive environment
- …access the support and quality services they need
- ...are able to achieve improved outcomes for their physical and mental well-being



#### How does UNICEF promote adolescent development?

- Placing adolescents' voices, agency and leadership at the centre of programmes; and empowering them for adolescent-led action
- Promoting multifaceted, multisectoral, integrated approaches
- Generating quality data and evidence as a global public good
- Working both for, and with, adolescents as equal partners
- Strengthening partnerships, including with girl-led networks and organizations

Placing a deliberate focus on adolescent girls that centres on their voices and agency, and using targeted strategies to reach out to and connect adolescent girls with services and support
