The para as articulated in the Government comment is in line with similar references requested by the Government to be used in the UN SDCF.</b></p>

	<p><i>which include children and young people.</i></p> <p>In the draft CPD for Azerbaijan published on the website of the Executive Board, paragraph 4 deviates significantly from the endorsed language.</p> <p>It is important for the Government of Azerbaijan that the above formulation is retained in the draft CPD. Therefore, we urge that the endorsed language be restored.</p>
