By 2031, people in Viet Nam, especially those at risk of being left behind, benefit from and contribute to a more just, safe, and inclusive society based on good governance, more responsive institutions, strengthened rule of law, and the protection and promotion of human rights, gender equality, and freedom from all forms of violence and discrimination, in line with Viet Nam's international commitments.

UNICEF CONTRIBUTION:


