Subject: Confirmation that the UNICEF Mozambique Country Programme Document 2027–2030 is derived from the United Nations Mozambique Cooperation Framework 2027–2030

Following a careful review, I am pleased to confirm that the Country Programme Document (CPD) 2027–2030 of the United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF) Mozambique has been derived from the results framework of the UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework 2027–2030 for Mozambique, as endorsed by the Government of Mozambique, and in accordance with the UNSDG Management and Accountability Framework.

The Cooperation Framework 2027–2030 is the UN system’s collective contribution to the implementation of the Government’s Five-Year Programme (PQG 2025–2029) and the National Development Strategy (ENDE 2025–2044). It is structured around three mutually reinforcing Priority Areas: (1) Leverage the Demographic Dividend; (2) Strengthen Institutions, Peace, Human Rights and Inclusive Governance; and (3) Drive Sustainable and Climate-Resilient Economic Transformation.

This country’s programming instrument will contribute to the UNCT’s collective effort to achieving the following outcomes:

1. UNSDCF Outcome 1: By 2030, more children and youth – especially girls, young women, and those furthest behind – experience enhanced well-being and strengthened capabilities to realize their full potential through equitable and inclusive access to integrated, quality services and supportive environments.
2. UNSDCF Outcome 2: By 2030, more people – especially women, youth, those affected by conflict and those furthest behind – participate meaningfully in society and hold public institutions accountable, benefiting from protected human rights and civic space, accessible justice, and transparent management of public resources, thereby reinforcing the social contract and contributing to a more stable and inclusive society.


3. UNSDCF Outcome 3: By 2030, more people – especially women, youth, those affected by climate shocks and those furthest behind – benefit from a diversified and climate-resilient economy driven by inclusive and sustainable agrifood systems, green and blue growth, and urban development, generating decent employment, safeguarding natural resources, and protecting communities.

The UNICEF Mozambique CPD 2027–2030 derives its programmatic direction from and substantially contributes to this Cooperation Framework by contributing most directly to Outcome 1, co-leading the UN's collective work on education, health and nutrition, WASH, child protection, and social policy – in particular for children and women who are furthest behind. UNICEF will also contribute to Outcomes 2 and 3 through its engagement on social accountability, humanitarian-development-peace nexus programming, and shock-responsive social protection in crisis-affected areas, including Cabo Delgado.

We appreciate UNICEF's active engagement in the Cooperation Framework design process and its commitment to the joint work plans and coordination mechanisms of the UN Country Team.

We look forward to the successfully coordinated implementation of this country programme through the UN joint work plans for the Cooperation Framework.
