”During the past two decades, there has been a dramatic increase in the use of rape and sexual violence as a deliberate tactic of war – a way of demoralizing and humiliating the enemy and destabilizing entire communities. In situations of armed conflict, girls and women are routinely raped, trafficked, used in prostitution, held by armed groups in sexual slavery, mutilated and forced to carry pregnancies. And we have barely begun to talk about it.”

These women are among millions seeking shelter from the fighting in Darfur. However, even in these camps, they constantly face the threat of rape and violence - as do their daughters.

In the Democratic Republic of Congo, hundreds of thousands of women are believed to have been raped since 1998. At a UNICEF supported centre, the women are given help and medical treatment – but they know that their attackers may never be brought to justice.

Across the border in Rwanda, an estimated quarter of a million women and girls had been raped during the genocide. Many who became pregnant were cast out by their families and communities.

10 years after the World Conference on Women, where 189 countries agreed to improve women's equality, world leaders are gathering again in New York to review any progress that has been made.

UNICEF is determined to see that steps are taken to protect women and children from these heinous crimes, and to make certain that all governments take swift and appropriate action against any and all criminals.

Summary:

Ten years ago, at the World Conference on Women held in Beijing, 189 countries agreed to improve women's equality. World leaders are set to gather again - this time in New York - to review progress made to date. UNICEF plans on taking this opportunity to steer the world's attention towards the systematic rape and sexual violence against women and girls during armed conflict.
