INTEGRATED CHILD WELFARE SERVICE MODEL

Indonesia's Ministry of Social Affairs and UNICEF developed the Integrated Child Welfare Service Programme (Program Kesejahteraan Sosial Anak Integratif - PKSAI) in 2015, with the aim of protecting vulnerable children and families - in particular child victims of violence, abuse, exploitation and neglect. Implemented at district and city government level, the programme strives to deliver greater coordination across agencies and more effective integration of service provision for better child protection outcomes across Indonesia.
