# UPDATE 15 LACRO COVID-19 EDUCATION RESPONSE: SCHOOLS REOPENING



[August 26th, 2020]

# 1. INTRODUCTION

As of 26 August, two countries in the LAC region, Nicaragua and Uruguay, have their schools open, while in others such as Anguilla, Brazil, Chile, and Haiti schools are partially open. In most countries of the region, schools remain closed, this is still impacting an estimated 138 million¹ children and adolescents. Where schools are still closed Ministries of Education and UNICEF continue to support distance learning for all children through various distance home-based learning resources (online platforms, printed materials, radio, TV, podcasts, WhatsApp, etc). However, reaching everyone remains a challenge. At the same time, at the Regional and National level, UNICEF teams are now working on developing protocols for the safe reopening of schools. This update aims to provide CO and partners some key information about the progress and tools developed in order to support governments in their preparation for the reopening of schools.



## 4. SUMMARY ON SCHOOLS REOPENING

As described in the previous sections, the reopening of schools has varied throughout the whole region. In **Uruguay**, all children have returned to face-to-face classes (with voluntary attendance) and in **Nicaragua**, schools were never officially closed (except for private schools where 60% have closed). In other countries such as **Ecuador**, **Brazil**, **Anguila**, **Chile and Haiti** schools have partially opened or are offering blended modalities (with attendance mostly focused in rural communities).


El Salvador, Guatemala, Costa Rica, Peru and Paraguay all have stated that schools will not reopen for face to face attendance during 2020. In Argentina, Belize, Bolivia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Guyana, Honduras, Mexico, Monserrat, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Saint Vincent & The Grenadines, Turks & Caicos, have no set dates for reopening schools in 2020 but will potentially reopen face to face classes during 2020. All offer remote/virtual learning modalities for the duration of the year.

Antigua & Barbuda, Barbados, Brazil, Colombia, Cuba, Dominica, Grenada, Jamaica, Saint Kitts & Nevis, Saint Lucia, Suriname, Trinidad & Tobago and Venezuela are planning to reopen schools during 2020 pending on instructions from their ministries of health or the finalization of summer vacations. There have been severe Covid-19 Outbreaks in the region further causing delays in presential school reopening.

Lastly, **Bolivia** has made a worrisome announcement communicating the cancellation of the remaining portion of the 2020 school year and the automatic promotion of all students to the next grade.

It should be noted that although many countries have not set a date for the schools reopening, some have decided to continue the entire school year trough distance learning, such as Peru or Paraguay, others, such as Ecuador or Colombia, are preparing to reopen by offering different modalities including face to face and distance learning. In Ecuador, for example, MoE has regulated two forms of education including home schooling and open education.


#### School readiness indicators, % of countries by rating in LAC (based on 27 responses)



## 5. GUIDANCE NOTES ON REOPENING SCHOOLS IN THE CONTEXT OF COVID-19

**UNICEF**, in collaboration with **UNESCO** and **WFP**, have developed two guidance notes on the reopening school in the context of COVID-19, based on the global framework for school reopening aim to provide recommendations and technical inputs to the Ministries of Education and for school directors and administrators for the planning, preparation and implementation of safe reopening of schools. The guidance suggested in these notes should be contextualized and adapted to respond to local conditions and meet the learning, safety, health and nutrition needs of each child and adolescent. Both guidance notes include checklists addressed for Ministries of Education authorities and school management (administrators and principles) for the different phases of reopening, and are currently available in English and Spanish (coming soon in Portuguese).

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
