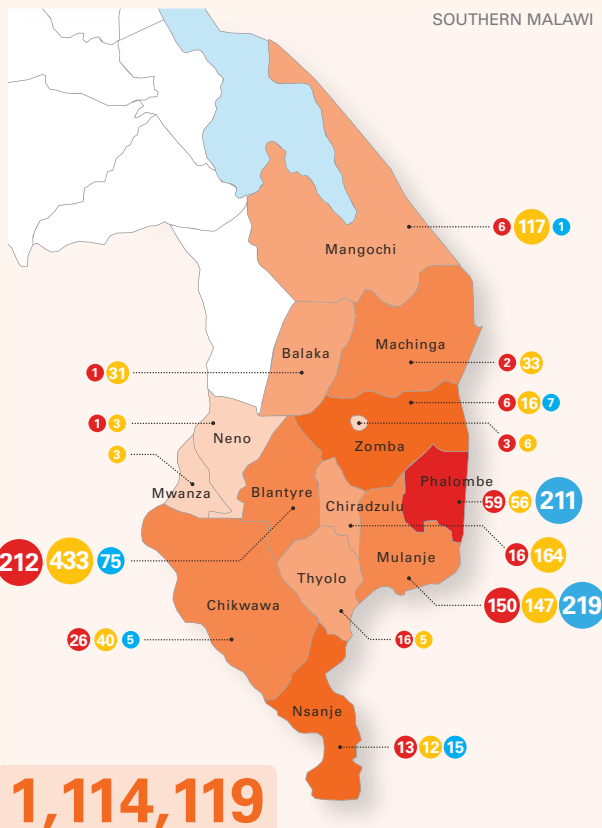

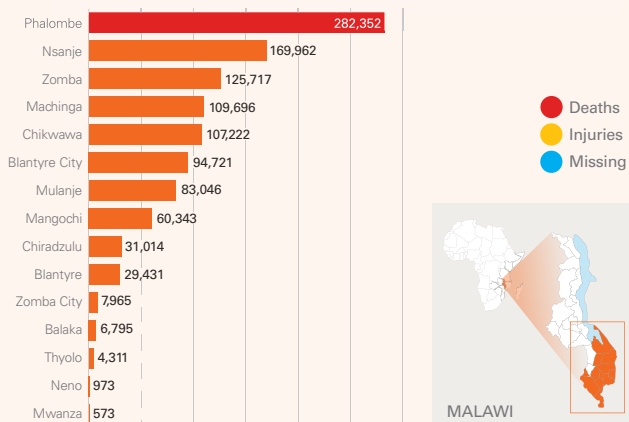

	FUNDING REQUIREMENTS (US\$)
WASH Provide supplies including buckets, soap, sanitary pads, hygiene kits, tarpaulins, chlorine. Construction and rehabilitation of water points, hand washing stations, latrines for camps.	\$4,500,594
Health Health care supplies, medicines, vaccines and cold chain; Mobile clinics for Primary Health Care.	\$5,274,400
Nutrition Distribution of nutrition therapeutic supplies, screening for malnutrition, community engagement on key family nutrition practices.	\$2,650,000
Child Protection Provide Mental Health and Psychosocial Support services for children, adolescents and caregivers. Protect children and adolescents from violence, abuse, exploitation and neglect.	\$1,489,900
Risk Communications & Community Engagement (RCCE) Awareness and dissemination of essential life-saving and positive behaviour change messages. Develop capacity and SBC tools of the mobilizers.	\$1,200,000
Coordination, Evidence and Monitoring System Search and rescue and aerial mapping for damage assessment through drones, quantitative and qualitative evidence and knowledge management.	\$1,050,000
Education High-performance tents for temporary learning spaces, WASH supplies in schools, and teacher training on ensuring school readiness for reopening.	\$3,157,000
Social Protection Emergency cash transfers to affected households and related sensitization and case management.	\$500,000
Humanitarian Advocacy and Communications Media outreach, advocacy and communication materials and stories, U-Report engagement and accountability to the affected population.	\$80,000
