





Operational and planned Blue Dots as of May 20 2022

Prior to the emergency, UNICEF had **country programmes and offices in 4 countries** engaged in the current refugee response, with a total of **106 regular staff members**.



UNICEF is now scaling-up operational capacity by recruiting **190 new staff across 6 countries**, including 2 countries without previous UNICEF country office and programme presence.
