Key Highlights:

-  **Major protection incidents faced by women and girls**
Women and girls continue to report systematic abuses they've faced whilst fleeing conflict in Sudan, including sexual violence. Quality gender-based violence (GBV) response services at scale at all points of entry (PoE) are vital to support survivors.
-  **Vulnerability increasing as nutrition admissions peak**
For women and children fleeing Sudan and host communities, conflict, displacement and rising costs are worsening malnutrition rates which are now the worst seen since the south Sudanese Civil war.

 **18,282**
children and pregnant women received EPI services including Measles and Polio through routine immunization.
-  **48,119**
health consultations conducted in Rotriak, Unity State, Renk, Paloich and Malakal in Upper Nile State.
- EDUCATION**
 **8,741**
children enrolled in schools in Upper Nile, NBeG and Unity States and Abyei Administrative Area.
- CHILD PROTECTION**
 **3,270**
children reached with PSS recreational activities in Renk and Malakal transit sites in Upper Nile State and in Rotriak in Unity State.

- NUTRITION**
 **69,584**
children under five and pregnant and breast-feeding women screened for acute malnutrition in all affected locations.
-  **22,448**
children and pregnant and breast-feeding women treated for SAM (5,749) and MAM (16,699) across all the locations.
- RCCE / SBC**
 **177,735**
People reached with key risk messaging on management of malnutrition, back to learning, safe WASH and Health practices in Unity, NBeG, WBeG States and Abyei Region.
