Introduction

For 27 years, the Government of Mozambique has demonstrated its own commitment to safeguarding the rights of children in the country. There are currently over 16 million children in Mozambique - 52 per cent of the Mozambican population¹. Similarly, the country is working towards achieving sustainable development goals for children in a context of high vulnerability to climate and global economic shocks, as well as internal challenges such as the conflict in the North, the implementation of the Demobilisation,

Disarmament and Reintegration Process (DDR) of former RENAMO guerrillas and implementation of Decentralisation Reforms.

The child welfare situation in different parts of the country varies significantly. In Sofala, over 540,000 children out of approximately 1.3 million live in multidimensional poverty. Thus 7% of children living in multidimensional poverty in Mozambique live in Sofala province. Children in Sofala are above the national average on most social indicators, such as the Theoretical Framework for Action on Health, Maternal In-hospital Mortality Ratio and HIV Prevalence. This profile is intended to encourage further efforts to improve the situation of children in Mozambique and in all provinces, thus ensuring a greater investment in the country's future.

This paper highlights the main indicators portraying the current status of children in Sofala province. The document is organised in two different sections, the socio-demographic situation and data on monetary and multidimensional child poverty.



¹ According to Article 4 of the CRC, Mozambique undertakes to "take all appropriate legislative, administrative and other measures for the implementation of the rights recognized in the present Convention ...and to ensure to the maximum extent of its available resources and, where necessary, within the framework of international cooperation". Article 47 of the Constitution, recognises the rights of the Child to protection and well-being and commits to take into account the best interest of the Child in all public and private decisions concerning children.

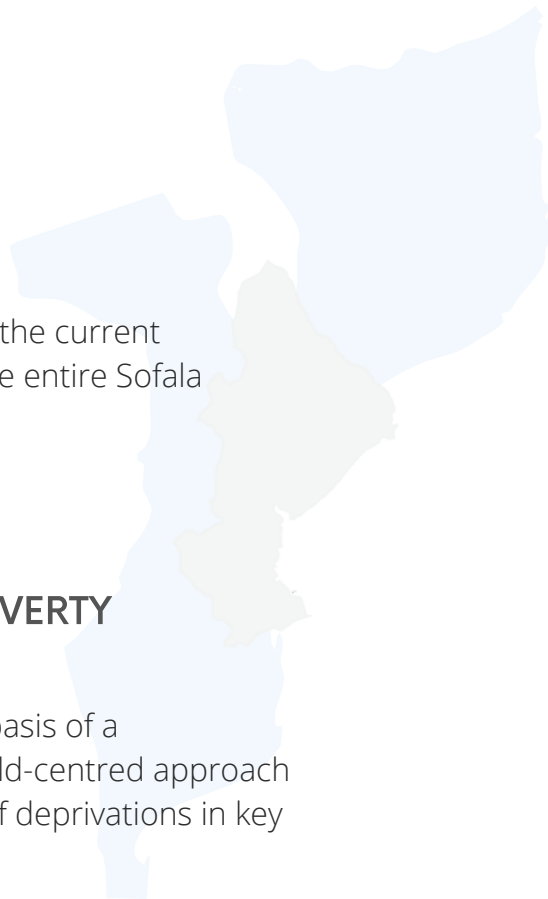

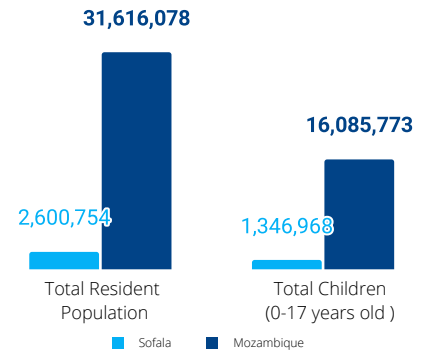

Main Sociodemographic Indicators

1.1 Population of Sofala ¹⁶

The central province of Sofala has **over 1.3 million children**, making up approximately 8 per cent of the total child population living in Mozambique.

1.2 Poverty Rates ¹⁷

Sofala has lower monetary and multidimensional child poverty rates than the national averages. In Sofala, children are more likely to live in poverty than adults.

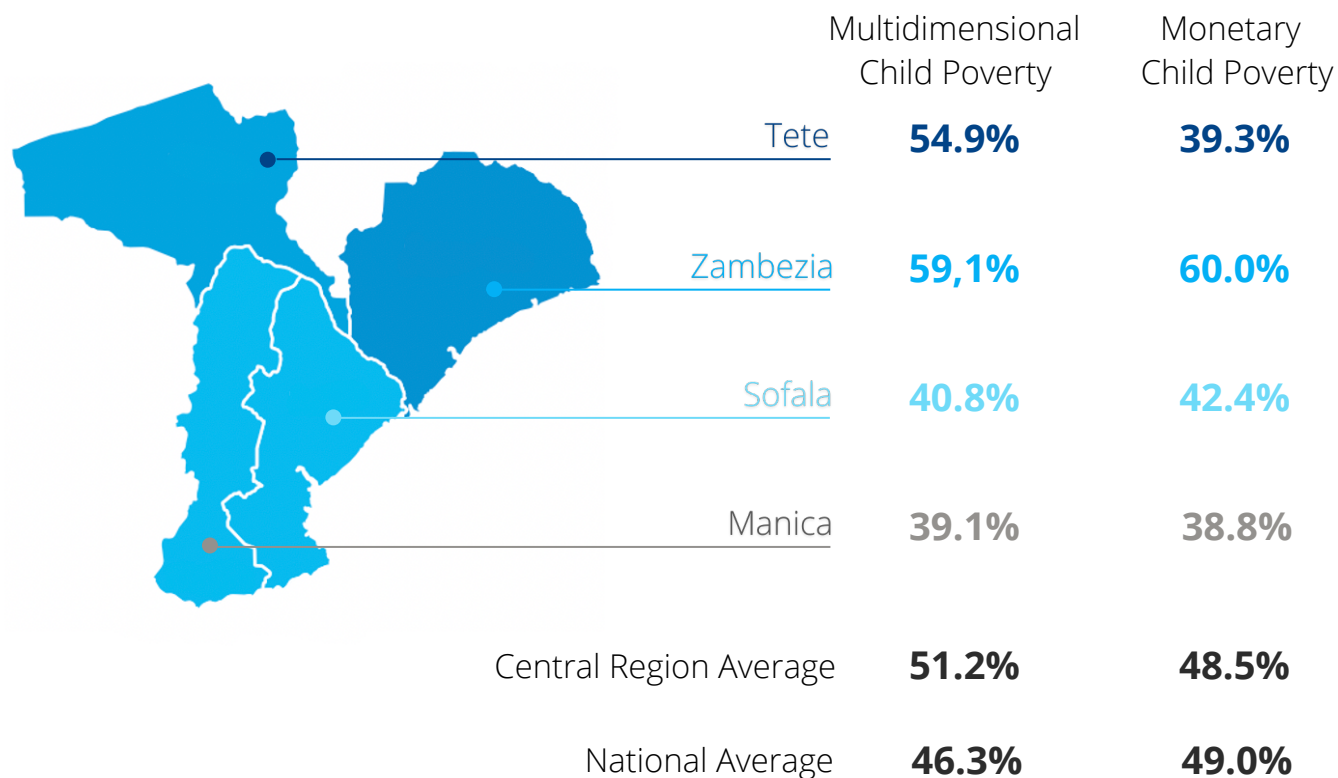

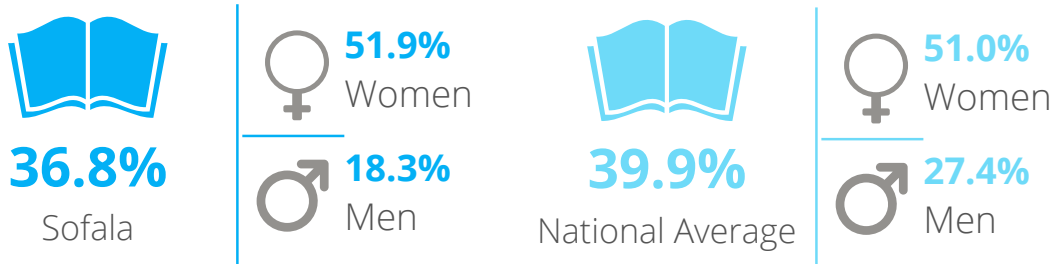


Over 540,000 children of the approximately 1.3 million in Sofala experience multi-dimensional poverty in some form. **Thus, 7% of children experiencing multidimensional poverty in Mozambique are found in Sofala province.** Cabo Delgado's child population represents just over 8% of the country's total population.

In addition, more than 570,000 children living in Sofala are under income poverty.

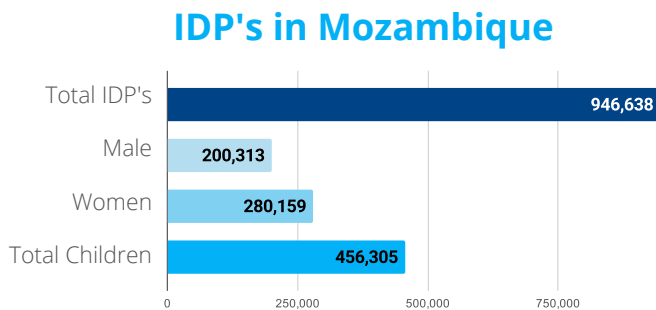
1.3 Illiteracy Rates ¹⁸

In Sofala, more than 3 out of 10 people are illiterate, compared to the national average of 39%, where almost 4 in 10 people are illiterate. Women are twice as likely as men to be illiterate.



1.4 Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) ¹⁹

According to data from the National Institute for Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (INGD) of January 2022, **there are 456,305 children displaced in the country due to terrorist acts in Cabo Delgado and instability in the Central Region.**



Of this number, **1,366 (the equivalent to 0.3% of the total number of displaced children) are in Sofala.** Other children are distributed in the following Provinces: Cabo Delgado (414,256), Nampula (35,027), Niassa (2,982), Manica (1,881), Zambezia (778) and Inhambane (15).

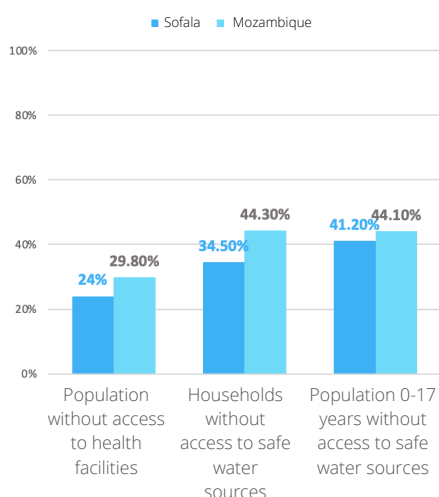
All the 3,376 people displaced in Sofala were in the Resettlement Neighborhoods.

1.5 Without Access to Basic Services ²⁰

In comparison to the national average, residents of Sofala are at lesser risk of living without access to a safe water source and without access to sanitary units. However, children in Sofala are at a higher risk of living without access to a safe source of water, compared to the national average.



According to the IOF 19/20, an individual has (easy) access to health facilities when he/she walks less than 30 minutes to reach the nearest health facility.

1.6 Health Infrastructures ²¹

Sofala has a total of 174 health facilities, however, as shown in the table below, around 24% of the population still lives without access to these facilities.

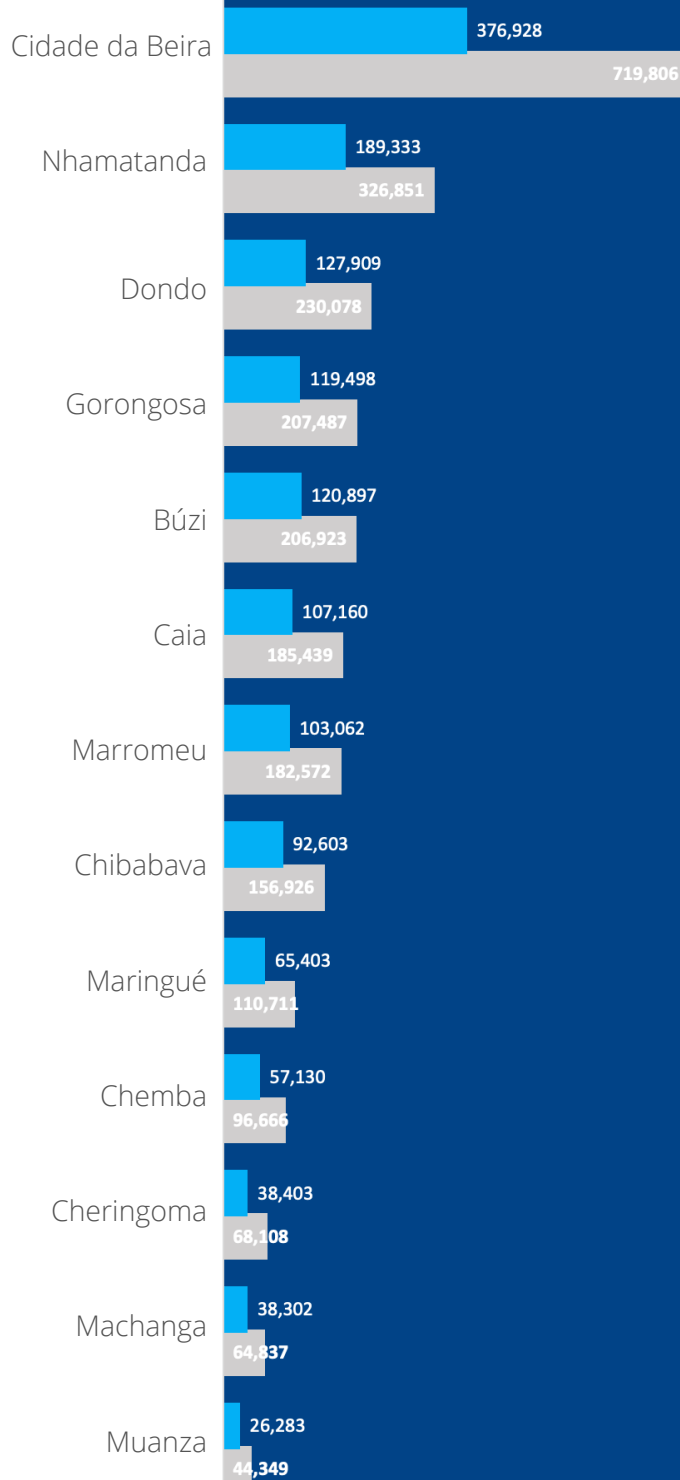

IMPOVERISHED CHILDREN

According to the results of the 2018 Longitudinal Assessment of School Dropout in Mozambique (ALDE), **the most deprived pupils are three times more likely to fall far behind in school** (four or more years) **than affluent pupils** (17% vs. 5%). 51% of pupils who ate breakfast on the day of the interview attended school assiduously, while 37% of those who had not eaten breakfast were either not very assiduous or never came to school.

SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT ²⁹

Verbal and physical violence were the main reasons for complaint. Complaints peaked in grade five (11%), where the average age of pupils is 12 years.

WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE (WASH) IN SCHOOLS

Primary school pupils were found to be **twice as likely to attend school when school latrines had a doors and walls**, indicating that ensuring the privacy of facilities can be important, particularly to ensure girls' attendance (ALDE, 2018).
