A.1 Household Survey Tool

Objective: Household Survey Tool is designed to measure and set baseline values of all quantitatively measurable key indicators which requires primary data collection as outlined in the result framework. This tool will answer the following seven impact and outcome level indicators.

- Proportion of ever-partnered women and girls aged 15 years and older subjected to physical, sexual or psychological violence by a current or former intimate partner in the previous 12 months
- Proportion of the working population in employment
- Proportion of population covered by social protection systems
- Percentage of men and women reporting that unpaid care and domestic work are shared in their household
- Percentage of men and women aged 15-49 who agree that a husband is justified in hitting or beating his wife for specific reasons
- Average income of economically active population supported by the project
- Number of individuals that have started and/or developed their economic units

If interview is unable to complete *in the third attempt household will be replaced.*
