**1** out of **2** births are attended by skilled birth attendants



**1** in **200** women die from pregnancy-related causes

## What are our priorities?



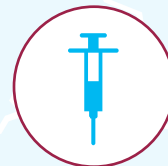
Reducing maternal and newborn deaths

Scale up delivery of Maternal, Newborn, Child and Adolescent Health Services integrated with HIV



Providing children and families in humanitarian crisis with access to quality healthcare services

### What have we accomplished?

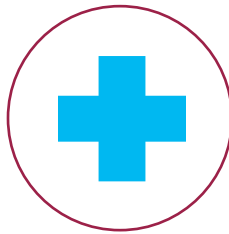


Improved national routine immunization coverage

**56.6%** of infants (children under one) received Penta 3

**647,252 litre** capacity added to the vaccine storage capacity

**40 million** doses of COVID vaccine delivered to the country



More than **5.2 million** primary healthcare consultations in development and humanitarian settings annually



Primary Healthcare Leadership Challenge Fund contributing to sustainable healthcare financing and creating healthy competition



**50.7 %** of births attended to by skilled providers

**69.6%** of pregnant mothers attended at least one antenatal care by skilled provider
