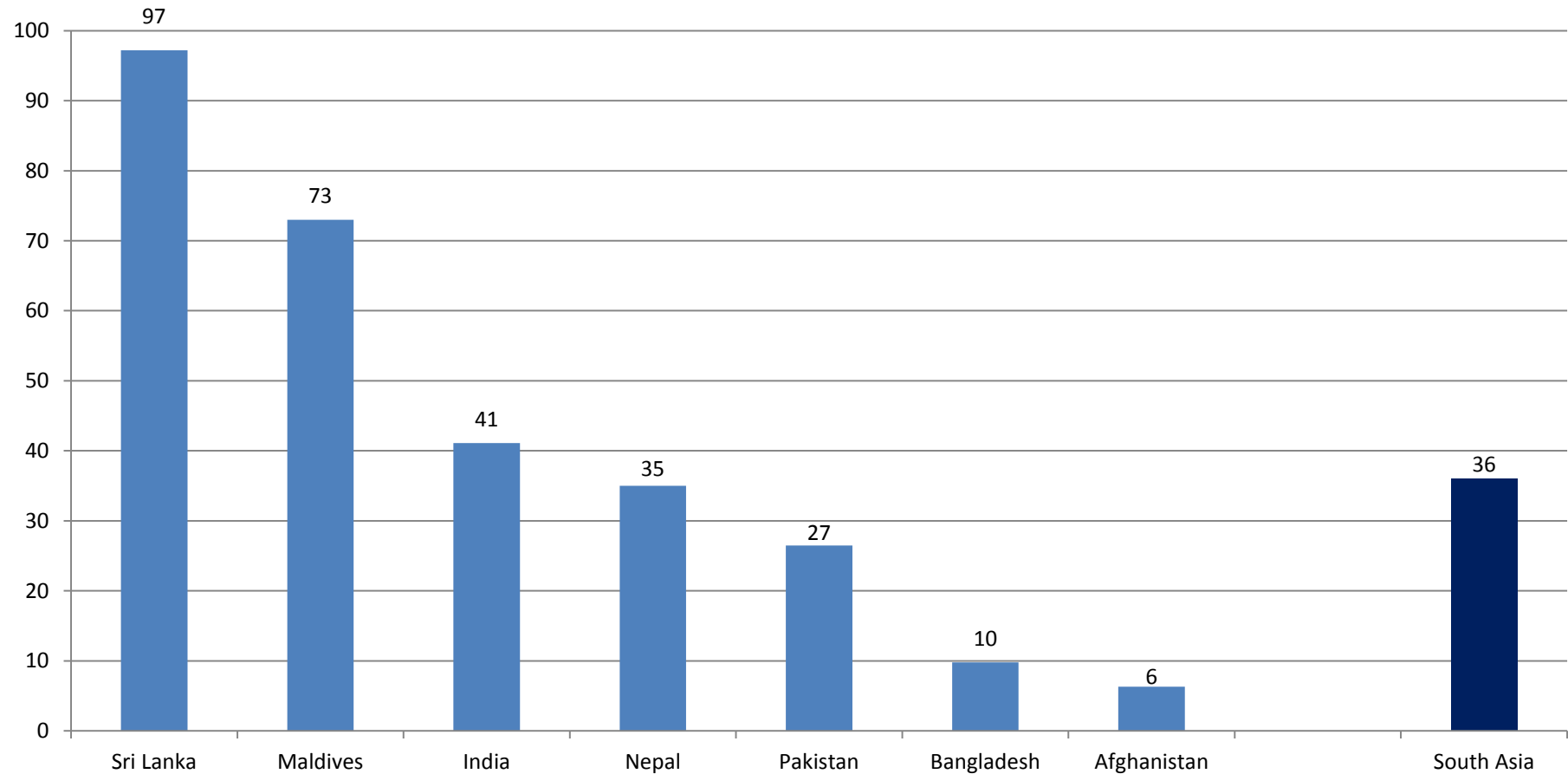

Birth Registration - South Asia region

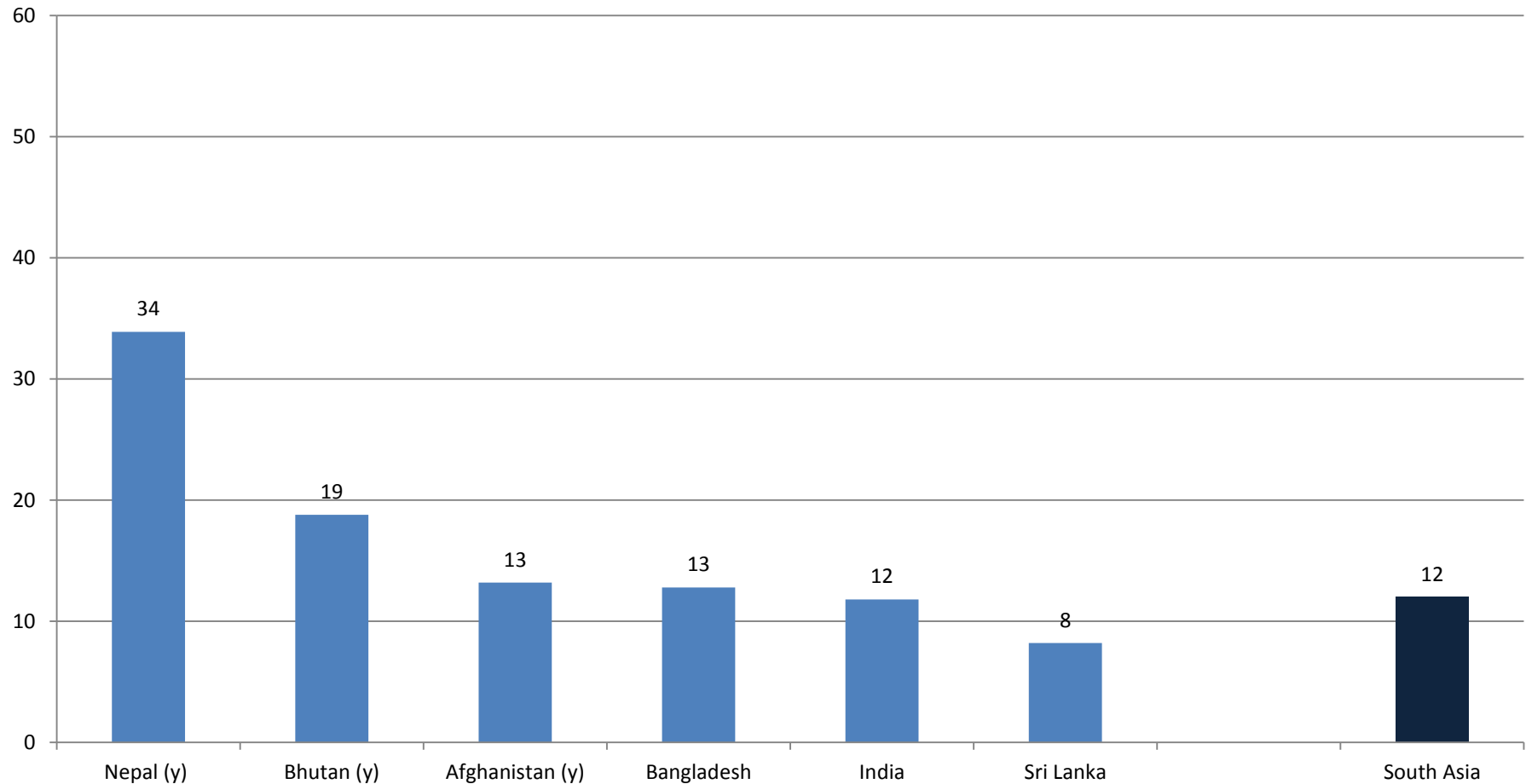
Percentage of children less than five years old who were registered at the moment of the survey, by countries in the South Asia region

Percentage of children 5-14 years involved in child labour at the moment of the survey, by countries in the South Asia region



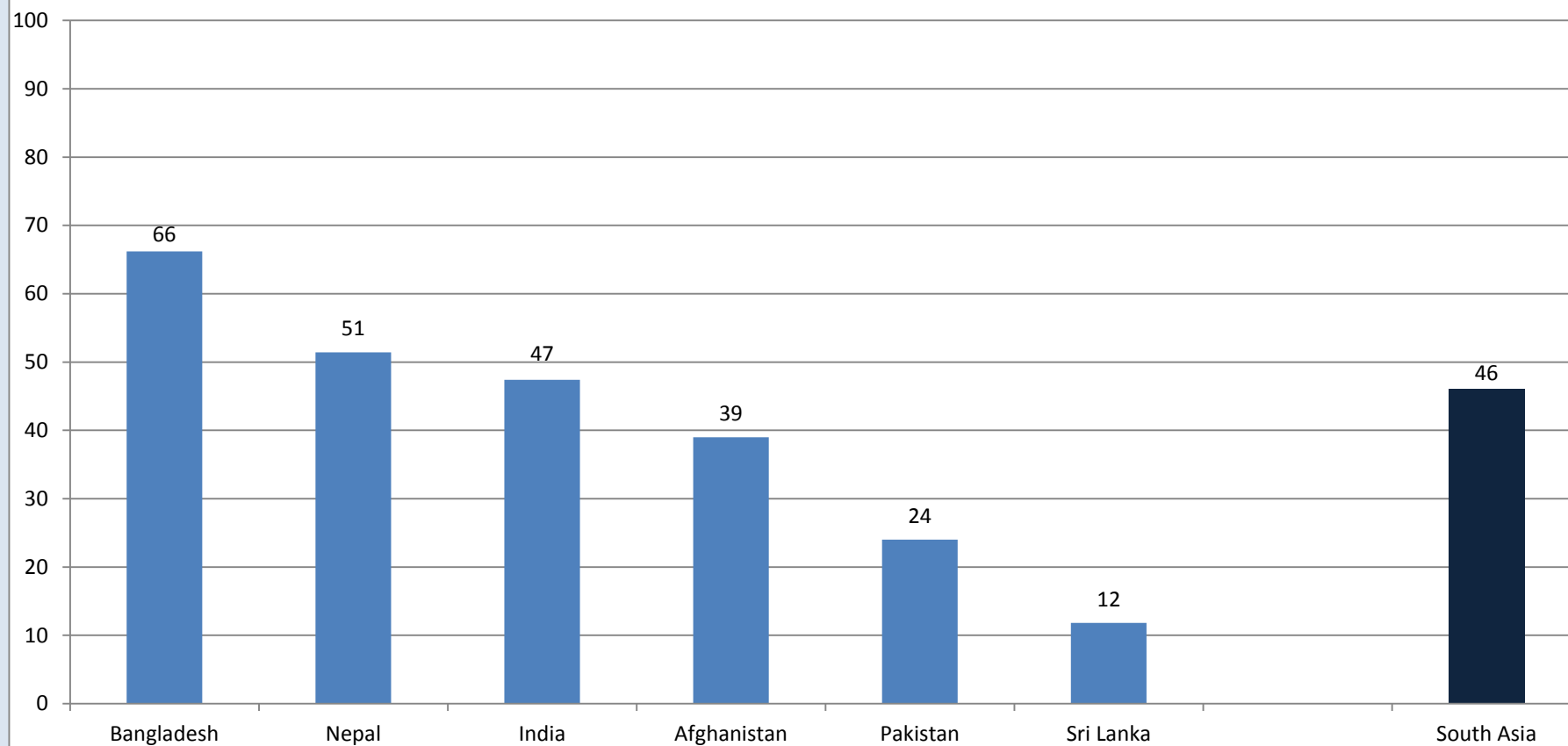

Definition of child labour: A child is considered to be involved in child labour under the following conditions: (a) children 5-11 years old who, during the week preceding the survey, did at least one hour of economic activity or at least 28 hours of household chores, or (b) children 12-14 years old who, during the week preceding the survey, did at least 14 hours of economic activity or at least 28 hours of household chores.

Child Marriage - South Asia region

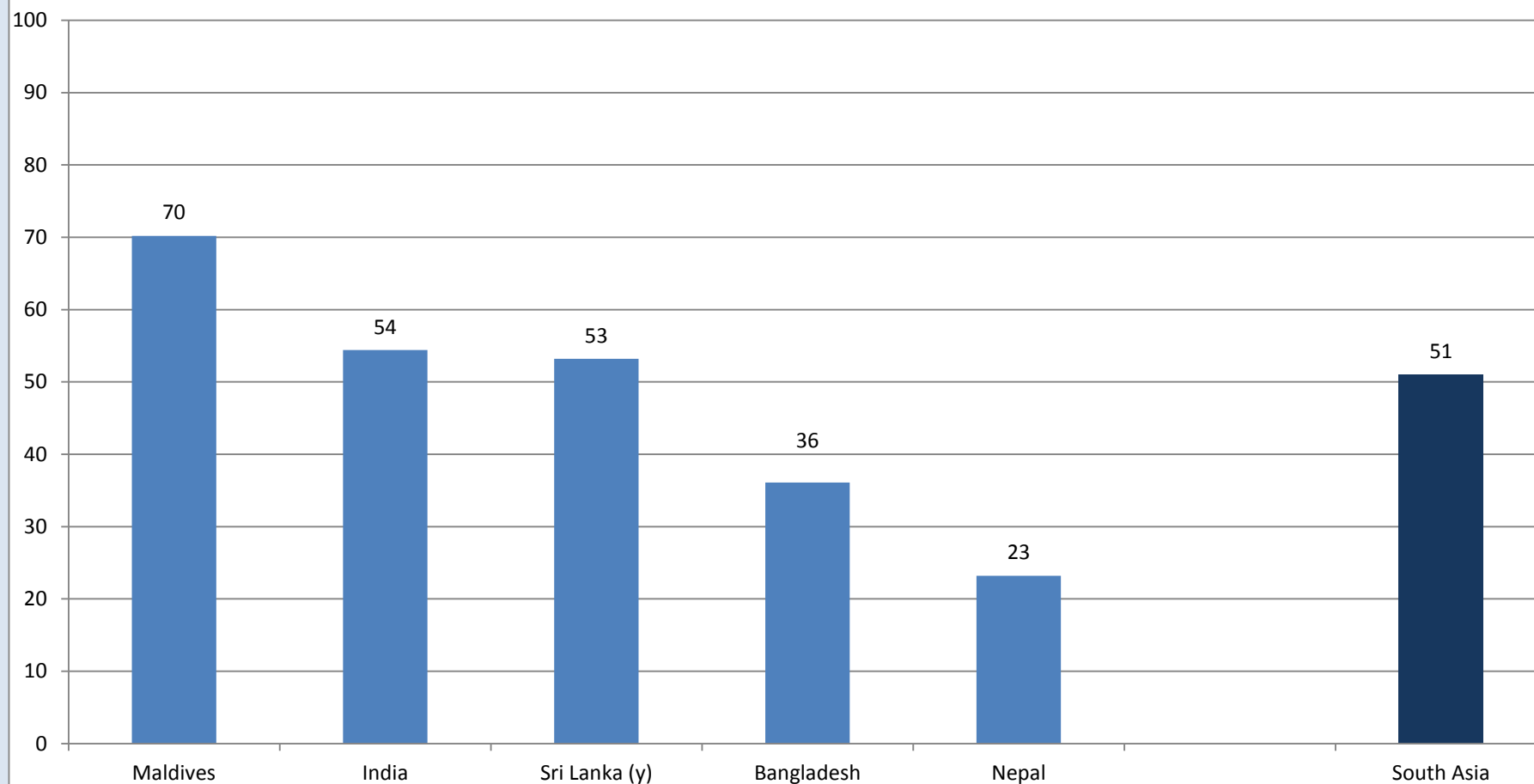
Percentage of women 20-24 years old who were first married or in union before they were 18 years old, by countries in the South Asia region
