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I. GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

AURORA

For the community workers teams at local level, the diagnosis of vulnerabilities is a very important step since it informs the individual intervention plan, including the social services to be provided for the vulnerable children and their families.

To avoid discrepancies in the identification of 'invisible' children, a new methodology was introduced in 2014 for the full diagnosis of vulnerabilities, based on a clear grid of indicators used to collect information about the children and the members of their households and applied unitarily to all children and in all communities.

Aurora is first and foremost a tool for community workers. It comes to support them in identifying vulnerable children in the community (diagnosis), in creating a minimum service package for the vulnerable children they identify and in managing the services that vulnerable children need. Furthermore, through the web platform wherewith the application is connected, Aurora represents an effective tool for the real-time monitoring of activities on the ground and data aggregation at different levels (commune, county, national levels), offering multiple options, from the management of vulnerable children's cases to timely project adjustments.

The methodology for defining vulnerabilities and related services was developed based on a broad theoretical background process and consultations with different stakeholders involved in the process. The methodology benefited from constant feedback from key project partners – representatives of General Directorates for Social Assistance and Child Protection and community (social and health) workers. Moreover, thanks to community workers' opinions regarding the methodology or the application received via e-mail and/or the feedback questionnaire available on the online Aurora platform, the methodology is dynamic and constantly adjusting to respond better, over time, to the needs on the ground.

Community workers play the central role in implementing Aurora. Aurora is a perfectible tool and the feedback received on the ground can identify the potential for growth. It is a tool which started from a recommendation included in the evaluation report and turned into a methodology which is defined with every single questionnaire applied, every household visited, every vulnerable child identified and helped. The key message to all community workers is to get involved in the development of Aurora.

MODELLING PROJECTS – UNICEF

Aurora must be understood in the context of UNICEF's project "*First Priority: No More Invisible Children!*", which starting with 2011 has strived to increase the impact of social protection policies on poor and socially excluded children and their families, through an intervention in eight counties: Bacău, Botoșani, Buzău, Iași, Neamț, Suceava, Vaslui, and Vrancea.

With social assistance services underdeveloped at community level, the project is based on the theory that Romanian children's welfare will increase only if and when children, especially the most deprived ones, benefit from enhanced access to social services (educational, medical and social assistance services). With all its activities and components, the project has produced overwhelming proof that the issue of 'invisible' children is highly relevant for rural communities in Romania and that it is a serious matter requiring an urgent and firm policy response.

In the first years of implementation, (2011-2012), the project identified 5,758 'invisible' children facing a multitude of complex vulnerabilities. Thanks to the minimum service package, more than 3,400 vulnerable children and their families could receive the social and medical services they needed. The

second project evaluation revealed that UNICEF's endeavour was quite complex, involving many social workers, an even greater number of beneficiaries, and a combination of vulnerabilities.

The second project evaluation (2013) showed that community-based preventive services could be developed through sustained efforts in spite of the limited human resources at local level and insufficient local budgets and that information activities could be implemented as a key to providing children (and other vulnerable groups) with the right to social security. Moreover, it offered clear evidence that community-based preventive services were more effective and much cheaper not just in theory but also in practice.

The evidence that was gathered within the modelling project, as well as the lessons learned were the ones that were used in order for UNICEF to develop a new modelling project, *"Social inclusion through the provision of integrated services at community level"* in Bacau County. The project has started in 2014, based on the experience in interventions at local level brought together by UNICEF and its partners, the newest project aims to testing a model of provision of integrated services at community level in Bacau County. In the first place, the services will be provided by community workers: social worker, community health nurse, social mediator, school mediator, plus school counsellor and other providers of quality inclusive education services for preschool and school, all under the coordination of local authorities and with technical and methodological support from the county level.

The activity will be based on methodologies that will help community workers to work together and will facilitate the identification and use of local resources and partners (local authorities, nongovernmental organisations, church etc.). Throughout the modelling project, a special emphasis will be put on the early identification and prevention of risky situations for children and their families. The intervention based on services provided at community level will be completed by communication activities and behaviour change addressing social norms, discrimination and stigmatization related to Roma communities.

The intervention will bring major benefits on multiple levels. First, it will improve the situation of vulnerable children and their families through reducing the risks related to violence against children and displacement from the family, through improving the access to services and offering a better chance for social and professional inclusion for adolescents.

The second level is the one referring to local authorities, the mayoralities that will benefit through the modelling project of a functional mechanism for identification, prevention of and intervention in cases of social exclusion. Moreover, local authorities will receive support in order to identify possibilities of budgeting the service providers through public funds and/or other funding sources, after the finalization of services. On a medium range, it is expected that investing in prevention services will lead to a significant cut in costs registered through specialized protection services.

Next, the third level is the county level. Within the project, a group of experts will be put in place at county level and will receive support in administration through a coordination mechanism that will be developed, in order to continue the implementation of such interventions. The coordination mechanism at county level will bring together representatives from social, health, and education, in line with the tendencies and the need of decentralization and adequate service coverage for vulnerable populations.

Last, but not least, the national level. The development of the provision of integrated services at community level concept was the result of a common initiative of the Ministry of Labour, Family, Social Protection and Elderly, the Ministry of Health, and the Ministry of Education, with the support of UNICEF. The modelling project will help putting the concept into practice and will offer the evidence and lessons learned that will allow to translate the concept in methodologies, standards, regulations and policies that will lead to the replication at a larger scale and to improving the lives of as many children and families. It is expected that this concept will be at the core of national programmes with public funding and funding from the European Funds.

THE GUIDE

This user guide aims to be an helpful instrument for community workers, county coordinators, but also for all persons who want to use Aurora or to understand all information that are not really visible in Aurora. The information included here corresponds to Aurora app version 1.1.1 and is structured into six chapters:

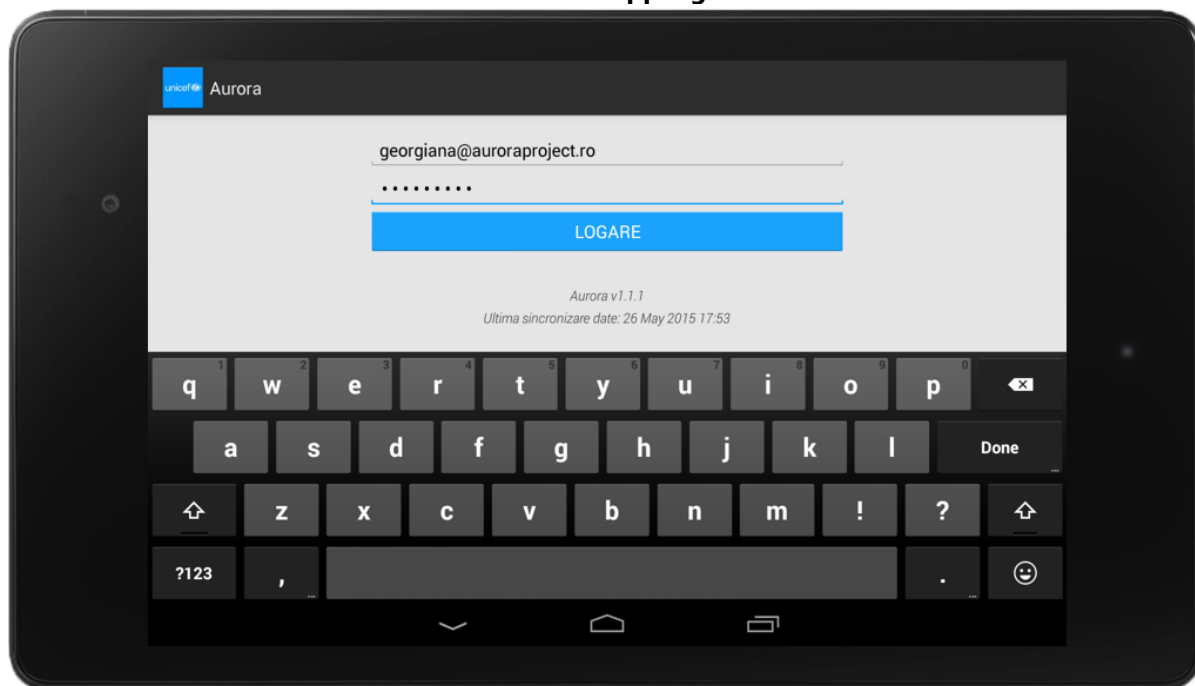
Chapter I – General Considerations presents Aurora and its development in the context of modelling projects "First Priority: No More Invisible Children" and "Social inclusion through the provision of integrated services at community level" in Bacau County. **Chapter II** – App Usage makes a short and very visual presentation of what users can see when they open the application, from login to service implementation, the screens available, the different buttons and their function, and how different types of questions are displayed. **Chapter III** – App Content comprehensively presents the 213 questions included in the application while giving additional information about the concepts used, who should answer each question, for whom and how each question should be filled in and what happens if a certain question is not answered. Also, where applicable, the guide provides additional information about the logical conditions used to display or to complete questions. **Chapter IV** – Children's and Mothers' Vulnerabilities Identified by Aurora provides an overview of the dimensions considered for determining vulnerabilities. **Chapter V** – Aurora-Managed and Monitored Services for Children and Their Caregivers presents the services delivered by social workers and offers additional information about the vulnerabilities requiring a certain service, the target beneficiaries of the service or the actions to be conducted. **Chapter VI** – Annexes includes a series of supportive information materials on issues related to the health and nutrition of children and pregnant women, vaccines, medical exams, etc.

II. APP USAGE

APP LOGIN

The first step in using the application is the community worker's registration on the tablet. S/he can log in with the user name and password received with the tablet.

Screen 1. App login



The **user name and password** are personalised. If the community worker has trouble logging into the app (s/he has forgotten/lost the user name and/or the password), the technical support team has to be contacted to handle the problem.

Both the user name and the password are digit and/or case sensitive. Consequently, when logging in, keep in mind that the application is sensitive to uppercase and lowercase characters, spaces, and digits.

The **app** will log out every day. In order to use the app, you will have to enter the user name and password every day.

Every time you log in, the **current app version** – Aurora v.1.1.1 – will show on the login screen. Any changes made to the app by the technical support team will automatically be installed on the tablet if it is connected to the Internet and will replace the version displayed on the login screen.

IDENTIFICATION SERVICES

The first project activity is re-diagnosing the vulnerable children already identified in the project based on the database with vulnerable children used for the second project evaluation in 2013 and the new cases identified before July 2014.

Along with Aurora implementation, each county had to carry out a number of initial services as presented in the table below.

Table 1. Number of vulnerable children previously identified in the project, by county

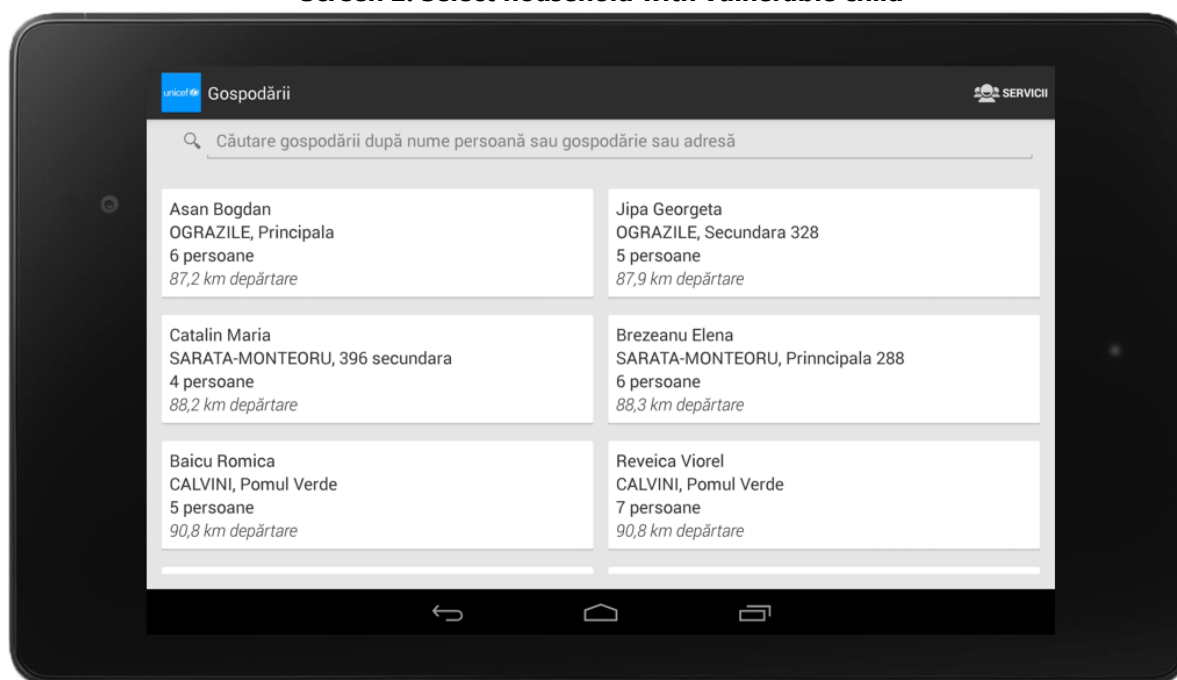

These initial services are intended to gather information about the child's name and address. The child's household must be visited and subjected to diagnosis (questionnaire application).

Once the diagnosis is done, the initial service will be marked as completed. Firstly, the child's household will be selected from the list of the newly introduced households and then the child in the household previously identified as being vulnerable will be selected.

The community worker will not only re-diagnose the children previously identified in the project. In parallel, s/he will identify new cases in the community and will gradually run a community census.

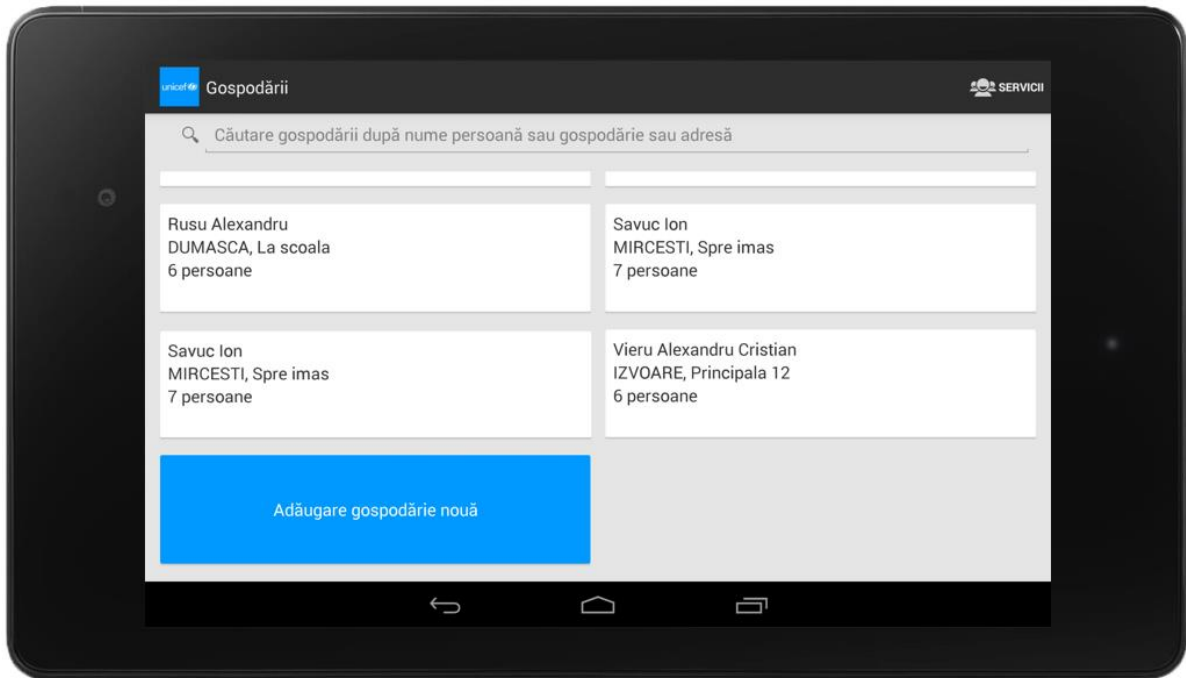
Screen 2. Select household with vulnerable child



ADDING HOUSEHOLDS

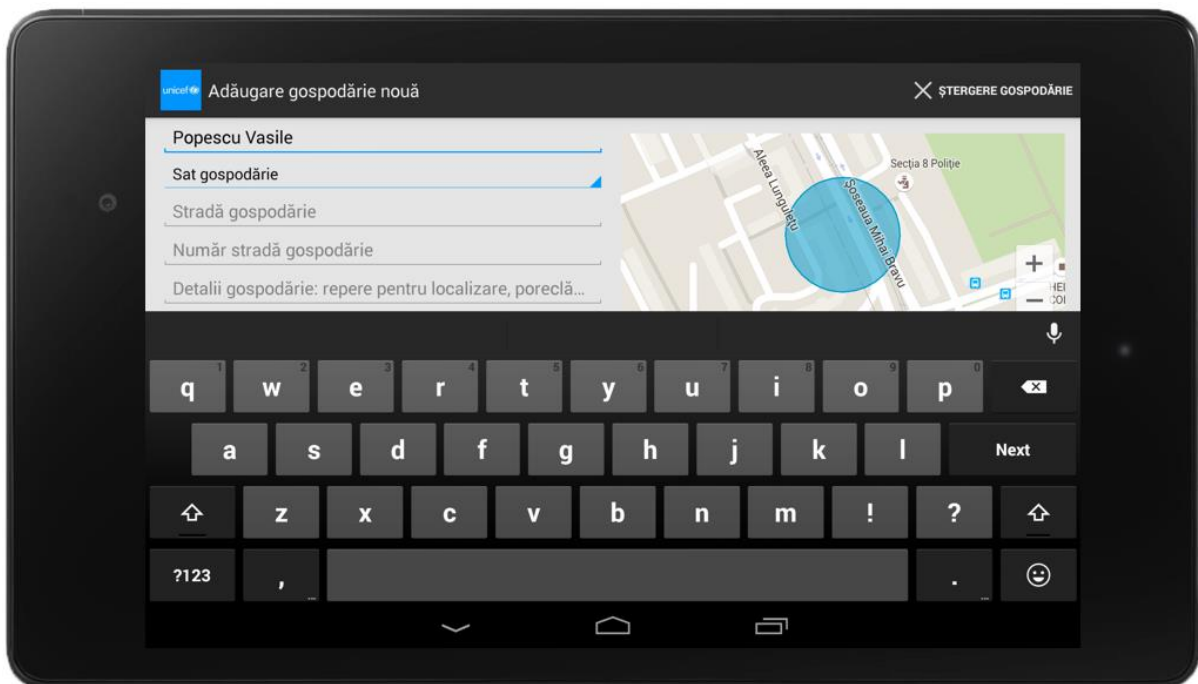
Before adding a new household, you **must** make sure it hasn't already been entered. It can be added as a new household in the app only if it is not already on the list.

Screen 3. Add new household



Households are ordered based on their distance to your location. The GPS coordinates of the household are automatically recorded.

When adding a new household, the household will take the family name of the household head. Although the household street and number are not mandatory fields, it is recommended to fill in as much information about the household so as to make it easy to find in the future. Also, any extra details will help locate the household more quickly.

DIAGNOSIS

Each household created will be added all its members. The list of household members can be edited/changed by adding new members, modifying the information related to existing members or deleting members only before questionnaire completion.

There are sets of questions for each household member and a series of questions for the entire household.

For the purpose of diagnosis, several types of questions were used:

1. Yes or no questions
2. Multiple answer questions
3. Questions requiring the respondent to phrase an answer or select a person/number/percentage/date (calendar day, month, year).

App questions are grouped by section and subsection. Each section contains a description of the way in which questions should be approached. Questions are also accompanied by recommendations and specific details.

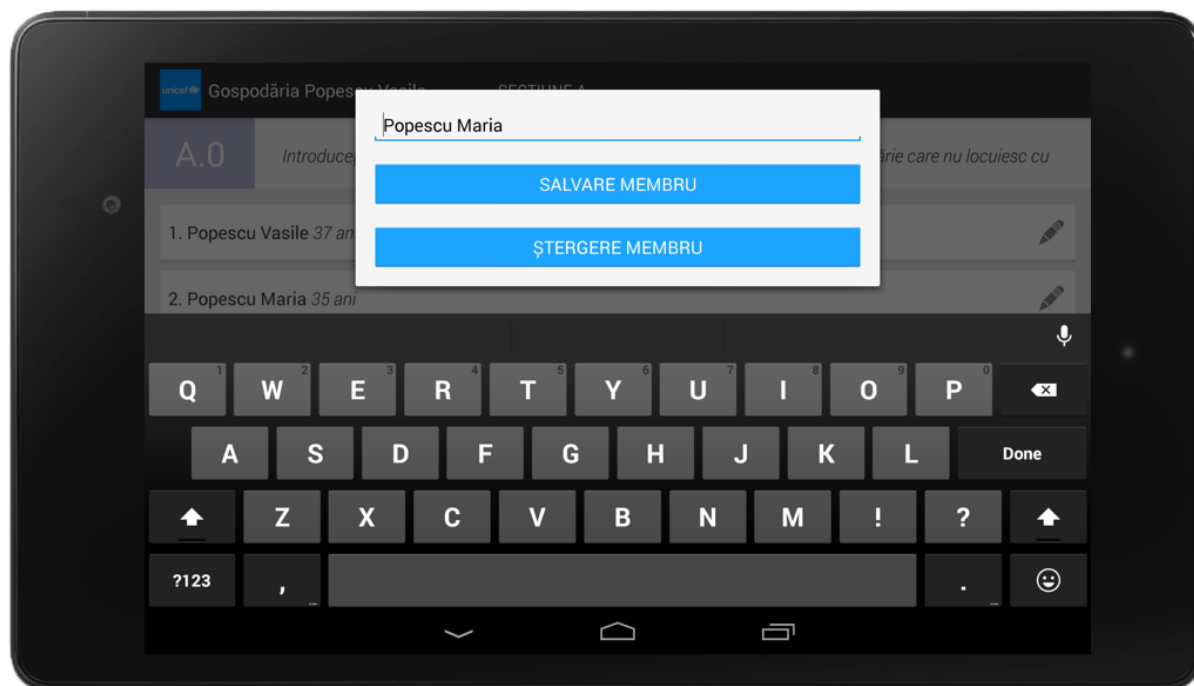
Household members

Each household member's full name (first name and family name) will be filled in. To register a household member, click on 'Add member'.

The list of household members contains all the members who have been entered. Members in the list can be deleted or changed (if you got the name wrong).

Before you move on to fill in household member data, check again that you have entered all people in the household. During household diagnosis (questionnaire application), you can go back to this list to add new members or to change the ones that have already been entered.

For all children in the household, parents must be entered in the Household Composition section, even if they are absent from the household or have never lived there.

Screen 6. List of household members



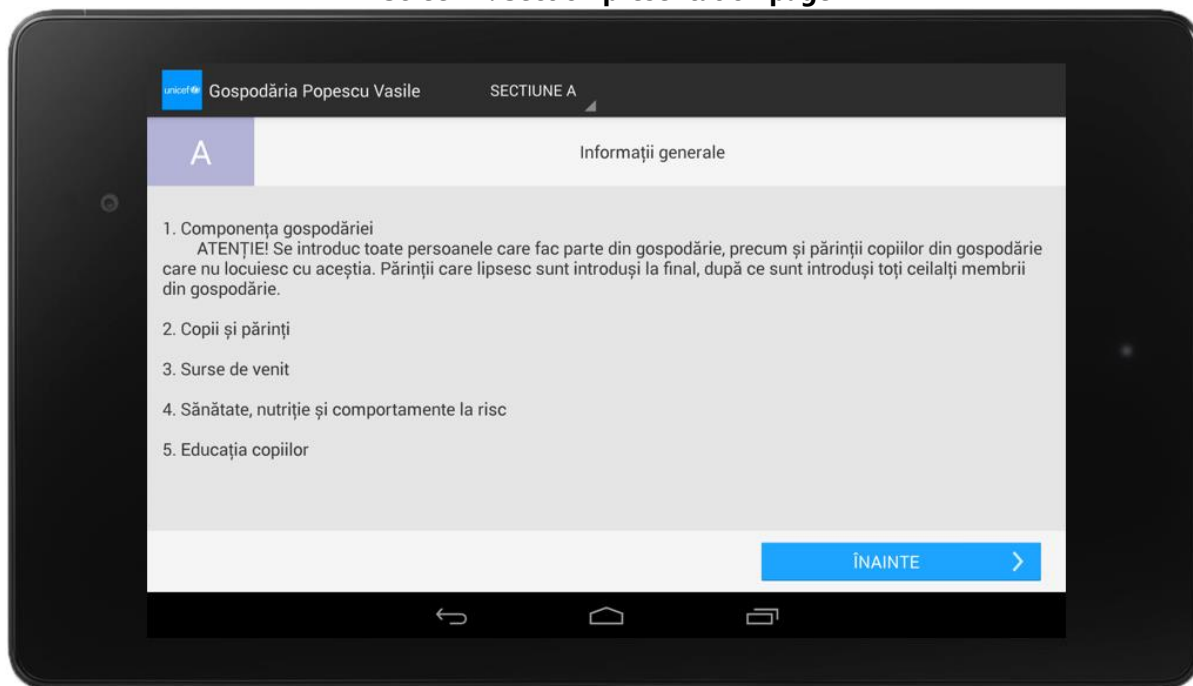
Sections

The 213 questions intended for household members are grouped into 7 sections as follows:

- SECTION A: General information (Household composition; Data about children and parents; Income sources; Health, nutrition and risky behaviours; Children's education);
- SECTION B: Data about household members under 1 year of age (Health; Education);
- SECTION C: Data about household members ages 1 to 5 years (Health; Nutrition);
- SECTION D: Data about household members ages 10 to 17 years (Health and nutrition; Sex education, spare time and risky behaviours);
- SECTION E: Data about women from the household aged 10 years or older who have ever had a partner (Contraception and childbirth; Children separated from their family or at risk of separation; Household work and inter-family relationships; Pregnant women; Underage mothers and women who gave birth in the last 12 months);
- SECTION F: Household data (Social benefits at household level; Earnings and expenses; Remittances; Living conditions; Parenting practices);
- SECTION G: Household data. Evaluation conducted by the social worker.

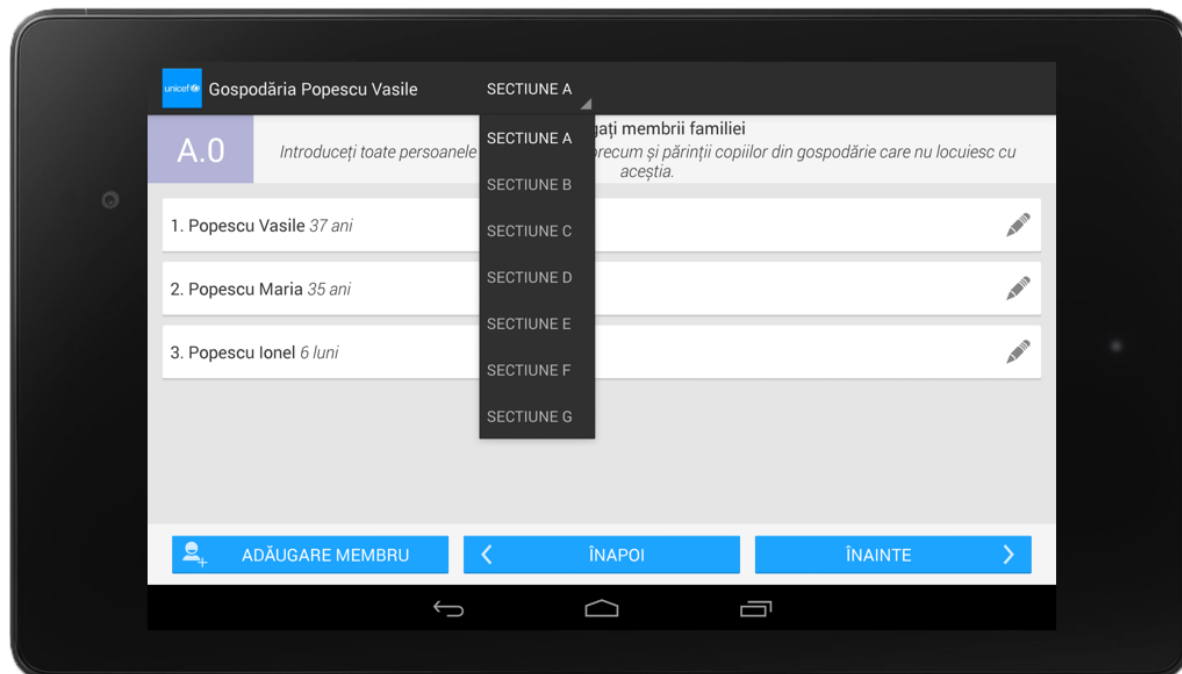
Each section comes with a page where subsections are presented and important information is provided about how questions should be answered.

In order to use the application as efficiently as possible, you can browse through sections using the section menu at the top of the screen. Sections can be browsed after the information corresponding to each section has been entered.

Types of questions

Individual questions for household members

An answer to these questions will be recorded for each household member. Questions apply only to those members for whom they are relevant. Consequently, the social worker will be able to fill in the answer only next to the household member who is not greyed out.

If the household has more members than shown on the tablet's screen, scroll down to view the entire household and record the answers of all members.


Screen 10. Questions for the entire household



Numerical questions

For the questions requiring a numerical answer, a keyboard will pop up on the tablet's screen to enter the numbers. According to the question, one can introduce the 13-digit National Identification Number, weights in grams or kilograms, etc.

To enter the information for the next household member, click 'Next' in the upper right-hand corner of the number pad.

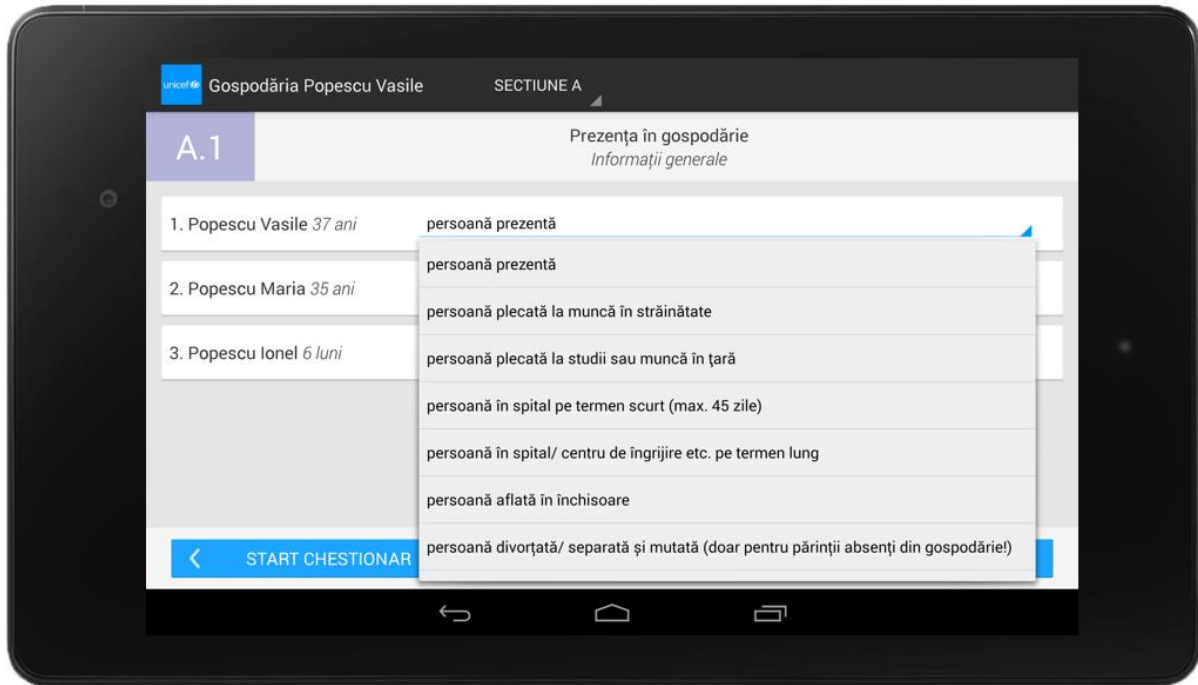

The answer to these questions will be chosen from a list of answers. Note: some lists feature more options than shown on the screen and you might need to scroll down the list to see them all.

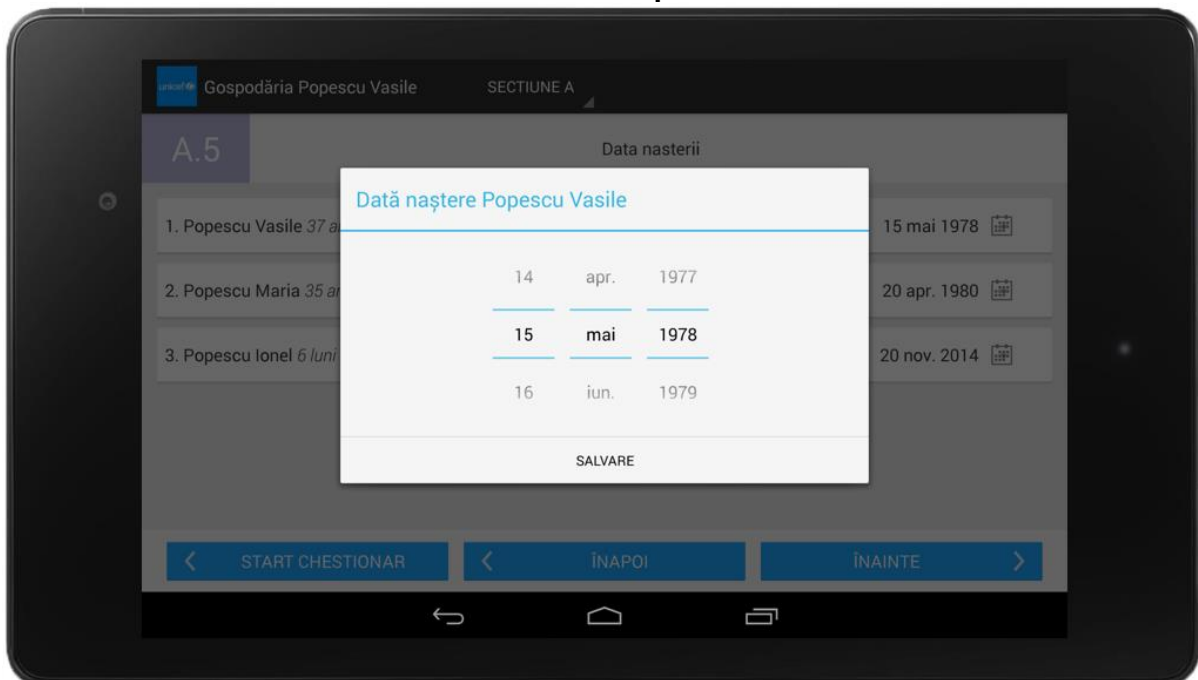
Screen 13. Multiple answer questions

To answer date questions, select the day, month and year for each household member. Note: some lists (years) feature more options than shown on the screen and you might need to scroll down the list to see them all.

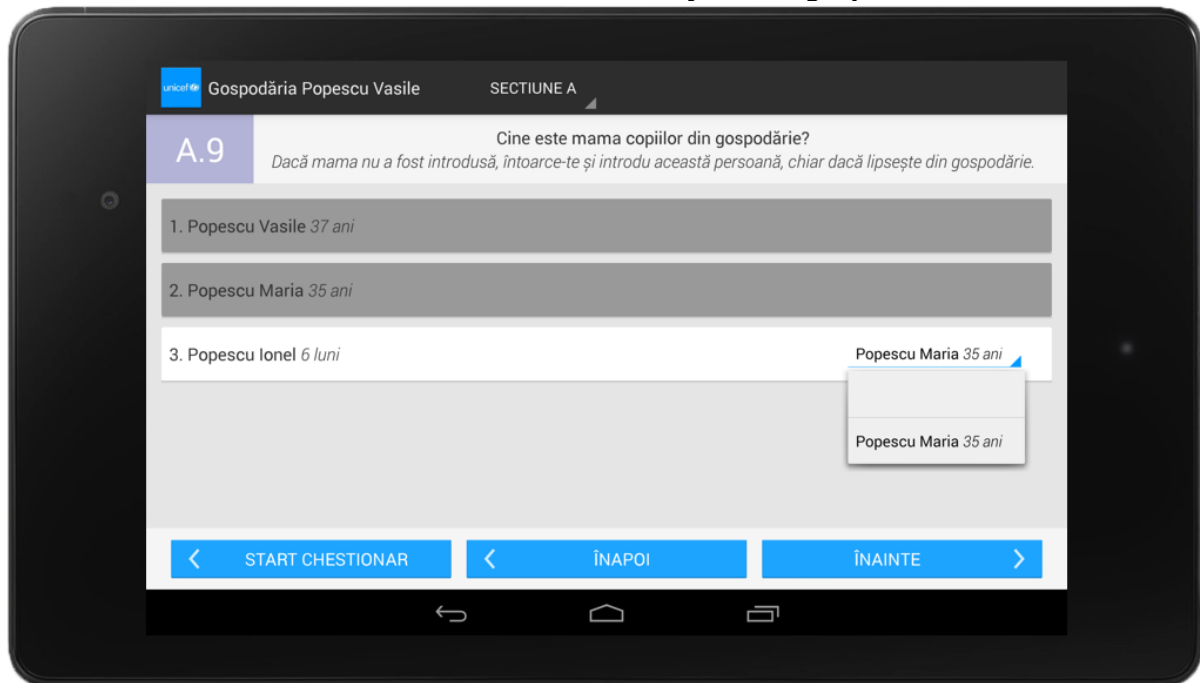
Screen 14. Date questions

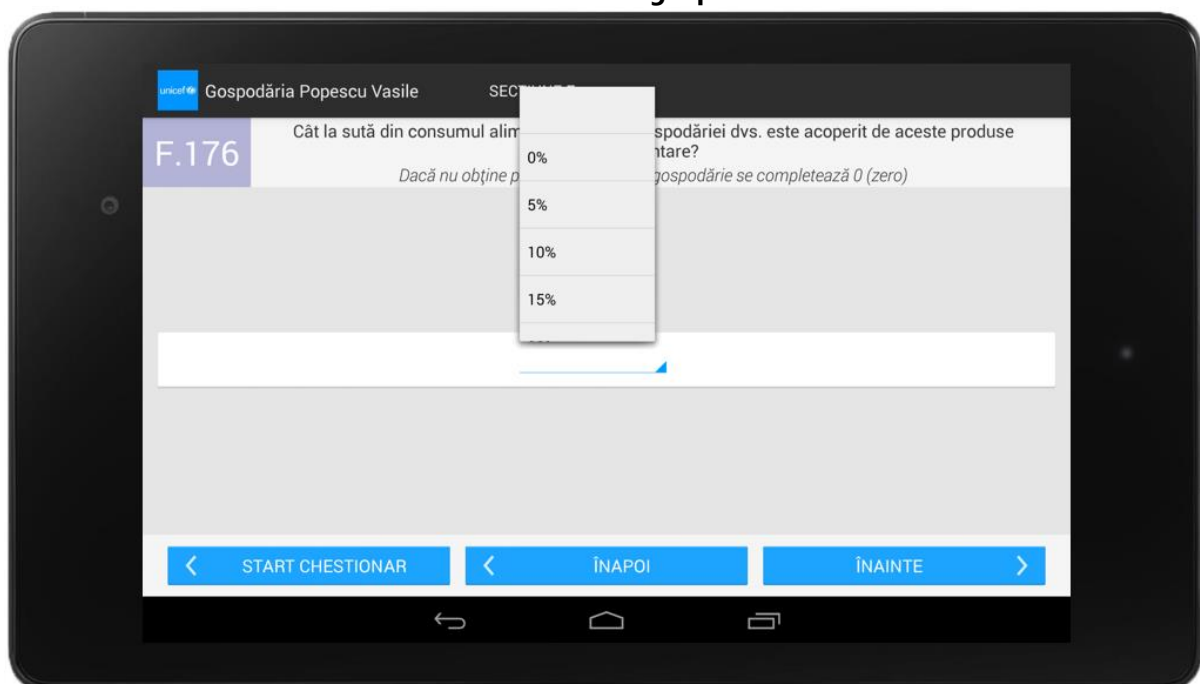
Screen 15. Questions answered by selecting a person

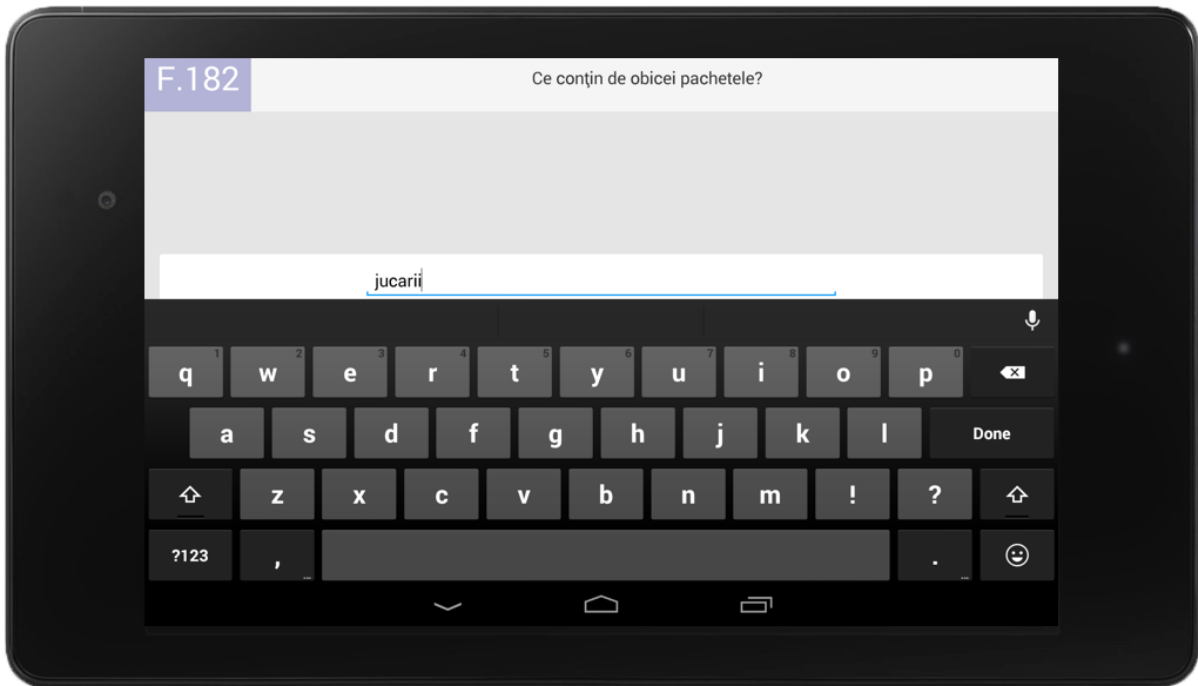
Screen 16. Percentage questions

The answer to these questions will be filled out in an accurate and concise manner.

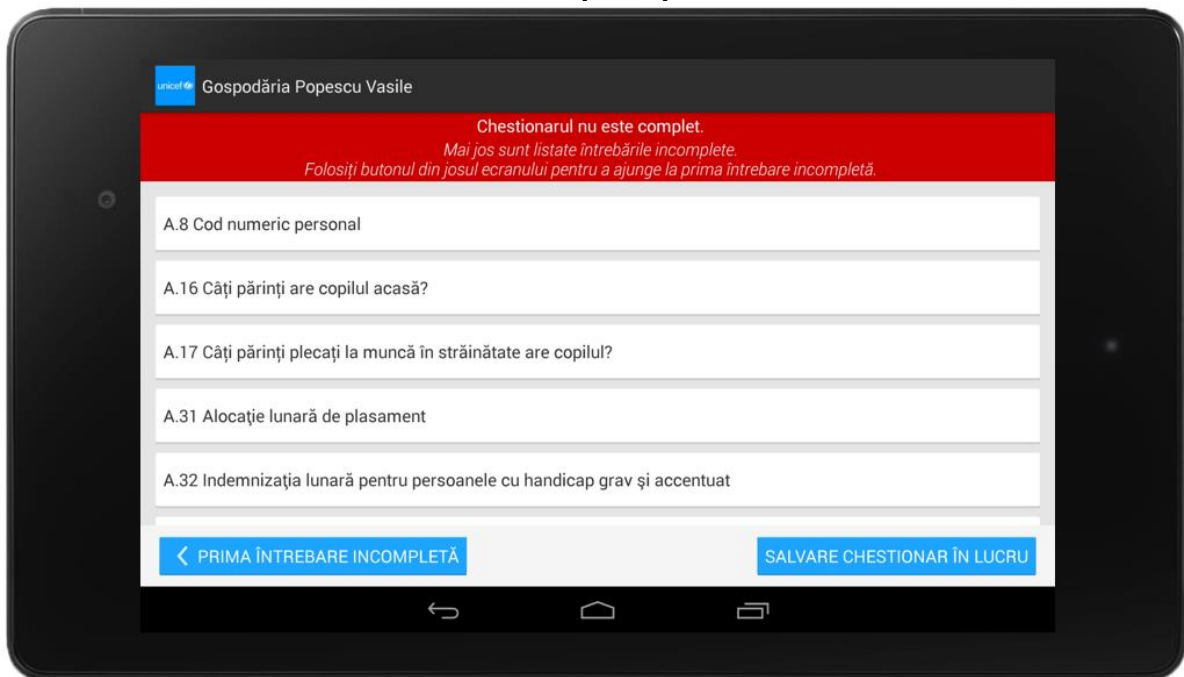
Screen 17. Text questions



DIAGNOSIS COMPLETION

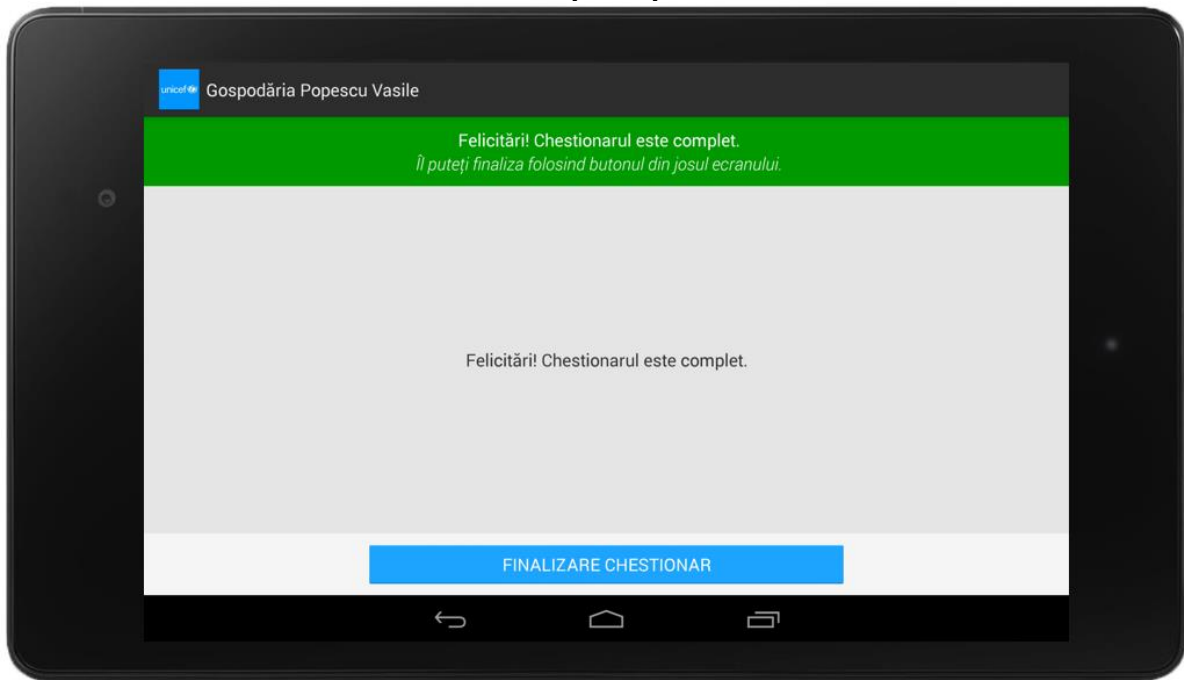
After going through all the questions, if any answers are missing, a 'partial completion' message will pop up. The app will inform you where you need to go back and enter the answer to complete the diagnosis.

Screen 18. Incomplete questionnaire



If all questions have been answered, the 'Questionnaire completion' button will be displayed on the screen. The diagnosis is considered finalised only after questionnaire completion. From that moment on, the app will display the identified vulnerabilities and the services the community worker has to deliver. Note: the moment the questionnaire is completed, no changes can be made to the recorded data. In order to change household information after questionnaire completion, the respective household needs to be re-entered.

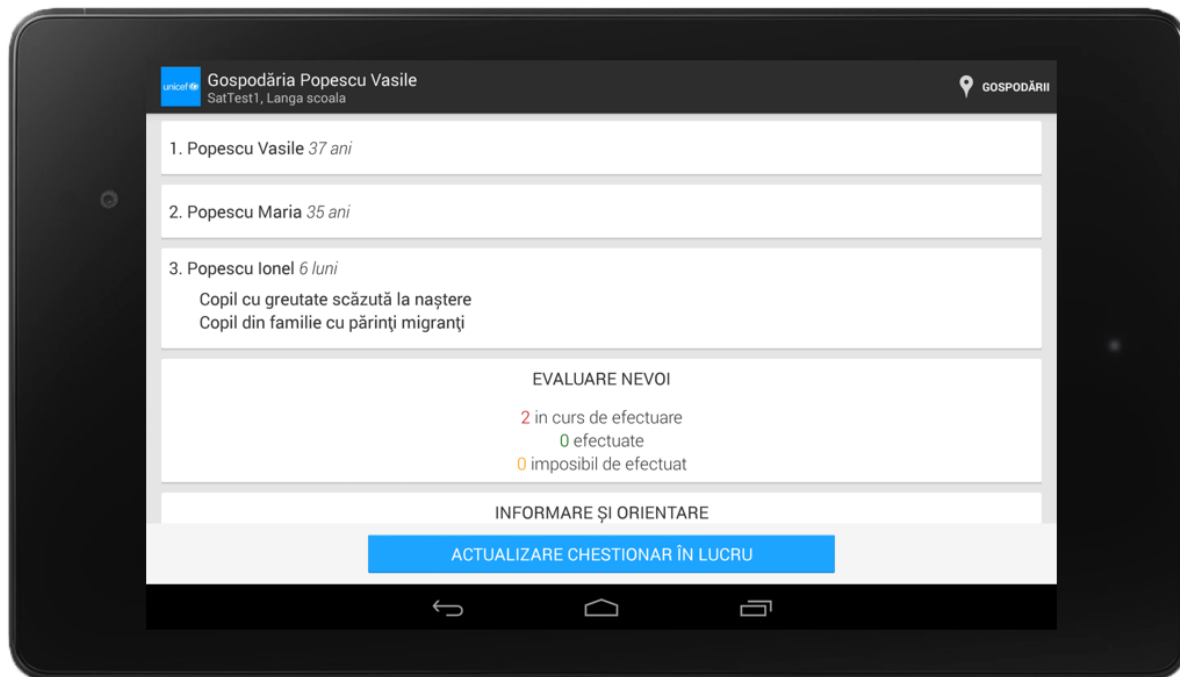
RESULT VIEWING

Diagnosis results (identified vulnerabilities) will be shown for each household member.

Services to be implemented for a household are grouped by service type and displayed immediately after the list of household members.

To find out more information about household members, click on their name displayed on the screen. You can view vulnerabilities and corresponding services for each household member.

SERVICES

The service screen shows all services available in the commune where the community worker carries out his or her activities. Services can be looked up in the search box using the household name or the person's name.

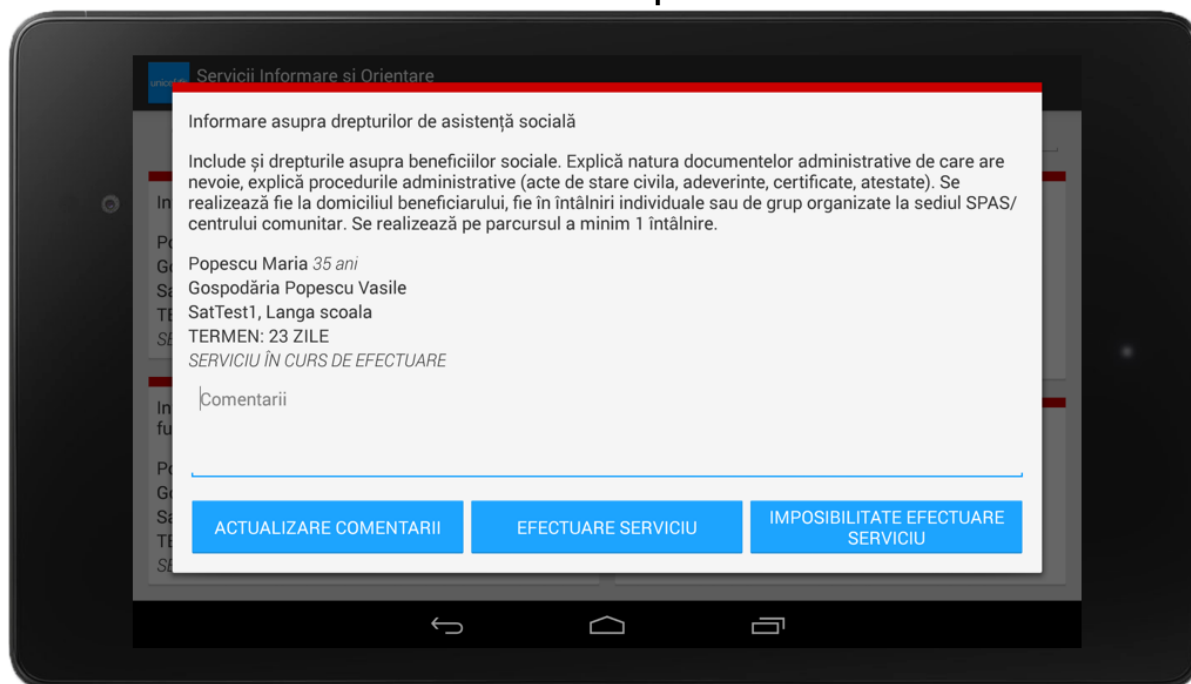
Screen 22. Services



Implemented services are marked by clicking on 'Service implementation'. Comments can be added to any implemented service (details about service implementation or information about the service). Any service which cannot be delivered (for reasons beyond your control) will be marked as such by clicking on 'Impossible to implement'.

For the services marked as impossible to implement, you will have to enter the reason why they could not be implemented in the comments section.

If a service has been wrongly marked as implemented, it can be reset.

III. APP CONTENT

SECTION A: General information

Before entering the data, it is important to know that a household may be identified through:

- Children in the list of initial services – the database with vulnerable children
- Direct identification (home visit);
- Notification from community members, local and/or county institutions;
- Direct request from the child/family.

In Section A, you have to enter general information about all household members.

Section A.1. Household composition

Household is a group of two or more individuals, with or without children, who normally live together, are generally related and look after their household together, contributing in full or in part to the household budget. Household members work the land or raise animals together and they jointly consume and use the produce thus obtained. The household may also be comprised of two or more unrelated individuals, with or without children, who declare that they have agreed to live together and manage a joint budget. Individuals who don't belong to a different household and who live and manage alone are considered to be part of one-person households.

The following are deemed household members and are registered in the application:

- Persons who are present, those who are temporarily absent or have left the household for a longer period of time, but no more than 12 months (to study elsewhere, on holiday, to relatives', to holiday homes, admitted to hospitals or nursing homes);
- Migrant workers (in the country or abroad), who have not set up another household or settled elsewhere and have been absent from the household for less than 12 months;
- Institutionalised persons (in homes for the aged, nursing homes for people with disabilities, placement centres, convents, etc.), who are part of but have been absent from the household for less than a year in the reference month;
- Persons deprived of liberty (in detention or under arrest) who are part of but have been absent from the household for less than a year in the reference month;
- The elderly and other dependants;
- Parents of the children from a specific household will be registered as household members even if they are absent or have never been present in the household.

The following persons will NOT be considered household members and will not be registered in the application:

- Persons living in lodgings or as tenants, as well as those employed for household services - generally persons who don't share a budget with the household members;
- Guests who are temporarily present in the household.

A0. Adding members

Who answers the question: A household member, age 15 or older, who is the primary caregiver (mother, father, grandmother, etc.) of children in the household or any informed adult from the household.

Question to be completed for: All household members.

What to do: Write the Last Name and First Name of all people in the household. For household members who have left the community, data is collected by interviewing the other household members.

The parents of children in the household must be added even if they don't live there, they have never fulfilled their parental rights and duties or they are unknown. Absent parents are entered last, after all the other household members have been added. For unknown parents, enter *Unknown father* or *Unknown mother* next to the name.

If you forgot to enter a person, you can go back to A0 from any app section and add that individual.

A1. Household presence

Who answers the question: A household member, age 15 or older, who is the primary caregiver (mother, father, grandmother, etc.) of children in the household or any informed adult from the household.

Question to be completed for: All household members, irrespective of whether they are present or not.

What to do: Select one of the options below, as appropriate:

- 1 - Present
- 2 - Works abroad
- 3 - Studies or works elsewhere in the country
- 4 - In hospital for a short period of time (max. 45 days)
- 5 - In hospital/nursing home/other facility for a long period of time
- 6 - In prison
- 10 - Divorced/separated and moved out (only for absent parents!)
- 11 - Deceased (only for absent parents!)
- 12 - Unknown circumstances (only for absent parents!)
- 100 – Other (e.g. termination of parental rights, criminal conviction with prohibition of parental rights, missing person or declared dead by court, etc.)

If the question is not answered:



You cannot move forward with the questionnaire.
The questionnaire cannot be completed.

A2. Household presence – Other (e.g. termination of parental rights, criminal conviction with prohibition of parental rights, missing person or declared dead by court, etc.)

Who answers the question: A household member, age 15 or older, who is the primary caregiver (mother, father, grandmother, etc.) of children in the household or any informed adult from the household.

Question to be completed for: Household members in other situations (response option '100 – other' was selected to answer question A1 regarding household presence).

What to do: Enter the situation. Examples of potential situations: termination of parental rights, criminal conviction with prohibition of parental rights, missing person or declared dead by court, etc.

If the question is not answered:



You cannot move forward with the questionnaire.
The questionnaire cannot be completed.

A3. Household presence - Did the person ever live in the household?

Who answers the question: A household member, age 15 or older, who is the primary caregiver (mother, father, grandmother, etc.) of children in the household or any informed adult from the household.

Question to be completed for: Household members with unknown circumstances (response option '12 - Unknown circumstances' was selected to answer question A1 regarding household presence).

What to do: Select one of the response options below:

1 – Yes

2 – No

If the question is not answered:



You cannot move forward with the questionnaire.

The questionnaire cannot be completed.

A4. Household presence – In what year did the person leave the household?

Who answers the question: A household member, age 15 or older, who is the primary caregiver (mother, father, grandmother, etc.) of children in the household or any informed adult from the household.

Question to be completed for: Household members who are absent from the household but lived there at some point (response option '1- Yes' was selected to answer question A3).

What to do: Select the year in which the person was last present in the household or, if s/he cannot visit, the year in which s/he was admitted to hospital/prison.

If the question is not answered:



You cannot move forward with the questionnaire.

The questionnaire cannot be completed.

A5. Gender

Who answers the question: A household member, age 15 or older, who is the primary caregiver (mother, father, grandmother, etc.) of children in the household or any informed adult from the household.

Question to be completed for: All household members, irrespective of their household presence.

What to do: Select one of the response options below:

1 – Male

2 – Female

If the question is not answered:



You cannot move forward with the questionnaire.

The questionnaire cannot be completed.

A6. Date of birth

Who answers the question: A household member, age 15 or older, who is the primary caregiver (mother, father, grandmother, etc.) of children in the household or any informed adult from the household.

Question to be completed for: Household members who are present in the household/work abroad/study or work elsewhere in the country or are in hospital for a short period of time (one or several of the response options '1 - present', '2 - works abroad', '3 - studies or works elsewhere in the country', '4 - In hospital for a short period of time' was/were selected to answer question A1).

What to do: Select day, month and year of birth.

If the question is not answered:



You can move forward with the questionnaire.

The questionnaire cannot be completed.

A7.

Does the person have an identity document (birth certificate/national identification number)?

Who answers the question: A household member, age 15 or older, who is the primary caregiver (mother, father, grandmother, etc.) of children in the household or any informed adult from the household.

Question to be completed for: Household members who are present in the household/work abroad/study or work elsewhere in the country or are in hospital for a short period of time (one or several of the response options '1 - present', '2 - works abroad', '3 - studies or works elsewhere in the country', '4 - In hospital for a short period of time' was/were selected to answer question A1).

What to do: Select one of the response options:

1 - Yes

0 - No

If the question is not answered:



You can move forward with the questionnaire.

The questionnaire cannot be closed.

A8.

National Identification Number

The **National Identification Number** is a 13-digit numerical variable which takes into account the date of birth and gender. If one of these conditions is not met/validated, warning messages will pop up on the tablet's screen.

Who answers the question: A household member, age 15 or older, who is the primary caregiver (mother, father, grandmother, etc.) of children in the household or any informed adult from the household.

Question to be completed for: Household members who have identity documents (they answered '1-Yes' to question A7), are present in the household or study or work elsewhere in the country or are in hospital for a short period of time (according to A1).

What to do: Enter the National Identification Number.

If the question is not answered:



You can move forward with the questionnaire.

The questionnaire cannot be closed.

A9. Who is the mother of each child in the household?

Mother: the mother is the female person who gave birth to the child or is the wife/life partner of the child's biological father or the person who has adopted the child. By 'mother' we mean the female person who is present in the household and plays the role of a mother to the child, not necessarily the person listed on the child's birth certificate.

Who answers the question: A household member, age 15 or older, who is the primary caregiver (mother, father, grandmother, etc.) of children in the household or any informed adult from the household.

Question to be completed for: All household members under 18 years of age.

What to do: Next to each household member under 18 years of age, select MOTHER if she lives in the household and has been entered at A0. If the MOTHER has not been entered, she will be added to the list of household members (A0) with all the general information (household presence, age, gender, NIN, etc.) and she will later be selected for the child in question (A9).

If the mother is unknown, *Unknown mother* will be added at question A0 and later (at A9) be selected as the mother of the child/children in the household.

If the question is not answered:



You cannot move forward with the questionnaire.
The questionnaire cannot be completed.

A10. Who is the father of children in the household?

Father: the father is the male person who is the child's biological father or the husband/life partner of the child's biological mother or the person who has adopted the child. By 'father' we mean the male person who is present in the household and plays the role of a father to the child, not necessarily the person listed on the child's birth certificate.

Section A.3. Income sources

A28. Main employment status in the last 12 months

Employment status describes a person's situation based on his or her income-earning means, namely:

Employee – a person who works based on an employment contract in a business or social unit – irrespective of ownership – or for private persons in exchange for cash or in-kind remuneration in the form of a salary, commissions, etc. This includes all persons who perform permanent, seasonal, daily, casual or hourly work, apprentices, probationary employees, priests and pastors. Any person who looks after or supervises a child or an adult with disabilities and has an employment contract with the mayoralty (the SPAS) or the DGASPC is also considered an employee.

Otherwise employed (day labourer, informal worker, etc.). By convention, this status is recorded for day labourers, casual workers, associates working for public or private units based on service contracts or an agreement, as well as informal workers.

Employer – a person who works in his or her own unit (enterprise, firm, shop, company, farm, office, etc.) and hires one or several employees. This includes employers who are also employees in their own enterprise or commercial leasing or concession contract holders who hire employees.

Non-agricultural own-account worker – a person who works in his or her private unit or business, does not hire any employee and may or may not be helped by unpaid family members. This status includes independent entrepreneurs (mobile vendors, tutors, baby-sitters, porters, private taxi drivers, etc.), independent professionals (street musicians, plastic artists, lawyers), commercial leasing or concession contract holders who don't hire employees.

Agricultural own-account worker – a person who carries out agricultural activities on his or her own or with the other household members, working the land, growing orchards or vineyards, or raising animals, regardless of whether these are performed as main activities or casual and discontinued activities which generate non-salary income.

Family worker (Unpaid family worker) – a person who works in an economic enterprise, operated by a family member or a relative, without being paid a salary or compensation in kind. Peasant farm is considered such a unit. If several household members work in their own private farm, one of them – generally the head of household – is considered own-account worker and the others, unpaid family workers.

Registered unemployed – a person, aged between 15 years and the legal retirement age, who is fit for work and has no job commitment as defined in economic and social terms, seeking employment (including first job) and available to start work immediately. The person is registered with the employment office and may or may not have received the unemployment benefit, professional integration benefit, support allowance.

Unregistered unemployed – a person, aged between 15 years and the legal retirement age, who is fit for work and has no job commitment as defined in economic and social terms, seeking employment (including first job) and available to start work immediately. The person is not registered with the employment office and does not receive the unemployment benefit, professional integration benefit, support allowance.

Old-age pensioner – a person whose main source of income is the pension received as a result of former employment (including agricultural work) after attaining the retirement age.

Other type of pensioner - a person whose main source of income is the early pension, partial early pension, survivor's pension, or disability pension.

Pupil, student – a person attending a public or private educational establishment at the primary, lower secondary, upper secondary, vocational, technical, post-secondary, short-term or long-term tertiary level to train or learn a trade. Children who go to kindergarten are also registered in this category.

Homemaker – a person performing domestic work around the household such as cooking, doing the laundry, keeping and looking after the house, non-commercial domestic work, child rearing and education, etc., who does not get a salary or a pension (who earns no income).

Unfit for work – a person who is partially or fully incapacitated to work, whose disability level has not been established and who does not receive disability pension.

Other categories – persons maintained by other people or by the state – preschoolers (only children ages 0-2 years and those older than 2 years who are not in school), the aged, people with disabilities, persons deprived of freedom (in detention or under arrest, irrespective of whether they work while in detention) or who live on other income (rents, interests, annuities).

The **main employment status in the last 12 months** variable is age-correlated. Therefore, persons coded 1 (employee), 3 (employer), 4 (non-agricultural own-account worker) and 7 (registered unemployed) must be at least 14 years of age. Persons coded 9 (old-age pensioner) must be 60 or older. Persons coded 2 (otherwise employed), 5 (agricultural own-account worker), 6 (family worker), 8 (unregistered unemployed), 10 (other type of pensioner), 12 (homemaker) and 13 (unfit for work) must be at least 9, and persons coded 11 (pupil, student) must be at least 2 years old. Any person, irrespective of age, can be registered under code 14 (otherwise inactive). If these conditions are not met, the message '*Inconsistency between age and occupation*' will show on the screen.

Income from wages and other payments related to wages refers to all cash and in-kind income (estimated in RON at the sell price of the unit) in the form of wages, bonuses and allowances granted as a percentage or fixed amount for special working conditions (stipulated by law, individual employment contracts or collective agreements), for both the time effectively worked during normal and additional working hours and for the paid unworked time, net profit premiums and benefits, other income related to wages effectively cashed in the reference month, irrespective of the period for which they are paid and any withholding (taxes, contributions, instalments for hire-purchased goods and loans, etc.).

This also includes income gained from sickness or maternity leave benefits and in-kind earnings. The value of the latter will be estimated in RON. It comprises income from independent or casual work such as cash earnings from commercial activities, service provision, the exercise of a trade, independent professions, and intellectual property rights.

IV. CHILDREN'S AND MOTHERS' VULNERABILITIES IDENTIFIED BY AURORA

VULNERABILITIES FROM A METHODOLOGICAL PERSPECTIVE

The methodology of defining children's and mothers' vulnerabilities identified by Aurora draws upon national and international literature and practices in measuring children's well-being and/or poverty as well as their vulnerability¹, but also on the experience gained in previous projects².

The final list of 14 vulnerabilities (and 40 sub-vulnerabilities) is built upon five dimensions which show up in national and international research and were adjusted to national specificities – poverty, health, education, risky behaviours, housing – as well as a new dimension – family and social circumstances.

Vulnerabilities are based on a series of simple and comprehensible indicators which can be directly applied to the household by a community worker who may or may not have specialised training in social work or health care. Also, the indicators used target 'invisible' children, namely those in the most difficult situations, children who "are disappearing from view within their families, communities and societies and to governments, donors, civil society, the media and even other children" (UNICEF, 2006, p. 35).

The list of vulnerabilities and the grid of indicators measuring each vulnerability are meant to warn of a potential risk for the child/children or the woman/women in a household.

DIMENSION 1. POVERTY

1.1. Child living in poverty

A "Child living in poverty" is a child who lives in a household affected by income or extreme poverty.

(a) Child living in a household affected by income poverty: any person under 18 years of age who lives in a household where the income per household member is not enough to cover the basic needs of household members and amounts to less than RON 97/person.

The household income is the total income earned from salaries, pensions, child benefits, social benefits, sales and other sources by all household members (including the respondent). The income per household member is worked out taking into account only household members who are present/work or study elsewhere in the country/are in hospital for a short period of time (<45 days).

(b) Child living in a household affected by extreme poverty - any person under 18 years of age who lives in a household where (a) in the previous winter, they could not heat the home and suffered from cold or (b) they were unable to put food on the table and children went hungry at least once a week.

DIMENSION 2. HEALTH

2.1. Child not registered with a family physician

The vulnerability "Child not registered with a family physician" concerns individuals under 18 years of age who are not registered with a family physician.

2.2. At-risk child age 1 or under

An "At-risk child age 1 or under" is a child dealing with one or several of the following situations/sub-vulnerabilities:

- (a) **Low birth weight child** – any person under 12 months of age who weighed less than 2,500 grams at birth.
- (b) **Unvaccinated child** - any person under 12 months of age whose vaccination is not up to date, according to the mother/father/primary caregiver or the local doctor.
- (c) **Child who is not given Vitamin D and iron** - any person under 12 months of age who, according to the mother/father/primary caregiver, does not get Vitamin D and iron.
- (d) **Child under 6 months old who is not exclusively breastfed** - any person under 6 months of age who is not exclusively breastfed, according to the mother/father/primary caregiver.
- (e) **Child over 6 months old whose diet is not diversified** - any person aged between 6 and 12 months who, according to the mother/father/primary caregiver, does not have a diversified diet (does not eat vegetables/fruit or meat every day or eggs at least a few times a week).
- (f) **Underdeveloped child** - any child under 3 months old who cannot hold his or her head up, any child under 6 months old who cannot sit up, any child under 9 months old who cannot crawl, any child under 12 months old who does not babble, startle at noise, tracks objects with the eyes or giggles.

2.3. At-risk child aged between 1 and 5 years

An "At-risk child aged between 1 and 5 years" is a child dealing with one or several of the following situations/sub-vulnerabilities:

- (a) **Unvaccinated child** - any person aged between 1 and 5 years whose vaccination is not up to date, according to the local doctor.
- (b) **Child who is not given Vitamin D** - any person aged between 1 and 5 years who does not get Vitamin D, according to the mother/father/primary caregiver.
- (c) **Underdeveloped child** - any person aged between 1 and 5 years who cannot walk/talk/hear/see/smile/laugh.

2.4. Child with chronic illness or living in a household with members suffering from chronic illness

A "Child with chronic illness or living in a household with members suffering from chronic illness" is a child dealing with one or several of the following situations/sub-vulnerabilities:

- (a) **Child with chronic illness** - any person under 18 years of age who suffers from chronic illness, according to the mother/father/primary caregiver.
- (b) **Child living in a household with members suffering from chronic illness** - any person under 18 years of age who lives in a household where there is at least one chronic patient.

2.5. At-risk pregnant woman

An "At-risk pregnant woman" is a woman dealing with one or several of the following situations/sub-vulnerabilities:

- (a) **Pregnant woman not registered with a family physician** – any pregnant woman in the household who is not registered with a family physician.

(b) Pregnant woman who hasn't benefited from prenatal consults - any pregnant woman in the household who has not benefited from prenatal consults.

(c) Unintended pregnancy - any pregnant woman in the household who has not planned to get pregnant.

DIMENSION 3. EDUCATION

3.1. Child who has never been enrolled in school, who has dropped out or is at risk of dropping out

A "Child who has never been enrolled in school, who has dropped out or is at risk of dropping out" is a child dealing with one or several of the following situations/sub-vulnerabilities:

(a) Preschooler who is not enrolled in kindergarten - any person aged between 3 and 6 years who has never been enrolled in kindergarten, according to the mother/father/primary caregiver.

(b) Child aged between 6 and 9 years who is not enrolled in school - any person aged between 6 and 9 years who has never been enrolled in school, according to the mother/father/primary caregiver.

(c) Child aged between 10 and 15 years who is not enrolled in school - any person aged between 10 and 15 years who has never been enrolled in school, according to the mother/father/primary caregiver.

(d) Child at risk of dropping out - any person aged between 6 and 16 years, without special educational needs, who does not go to school on a daily basis, repeated the grade or intends to drop out.

(e) Child with special educational needs at risk of dropping out - any person aged between 6 and 16 years with special educational needs.

(f) Child who has dropped out - any person aged between 6 and 16 years who has dropped out.

3.2. Child who is not enrolled in crèche

DIMENSION 4. RISKY BEHAVIOURS

4.1. Adolescent/child with risky behaviours

An "Adolescent/child with risky behaviours" is a child dealing with one or several of the following situations/sub-vulnerabilities:

(a) Adolescent with risky behaviour in terms of a healthy lifestyle (diet and sports) – any person in the household aged between 9 and 18 years who did not eat fruit or vegetables, who did not have breakfast or who exercised less than one hour a day in the last 30 days.

(b) Adolescent with risky sexual behaviour - any person in the household aged between 9 and 18 years who did not talk about differences between boys and girls, about sex or about how babies are made with his or her family, friends, at school (with classmates or teachers). Girls are also considered at sexual risk if they did not talk about menstruation with their family, friends, at school (with classmates or teachers) or if they have or have ever had a sexual partner and they don't/didn't use contraception.

(c) Underage mother or pregnant underage girl – any woman in the household under 18 years of age who has declared that she gave birth to at least one live-born child or is pregnant.

(d) Adolescent with risky substance use behaviour - any person in the household aged between 9 and 18 years who smoked, drank alcohol or tried out drugs in the last 30 days.

(e) Child at risk of adopting violent behaviour - any person in the household under 18 years of age who got into fights or police-handled conflicts.

(f) Child living in a household with violent behaviour risks – any person in the household under 18 years of age who has not been involved in police-handled conflicts but lives in a household where other members have been involved in such conflicts.

4.2. Child from a family with child violence, abuse or neglect risks

A “Child from a family with child violence, abuse or neglect risks” is a child dealing with one or several of the following situations/sub-vulnerabilities:

(a) Child from a family with child violence risks - any person under 18 years of age who lives in a household where the most often used child discipline method is deprivation (no sweets, not allowed to watch TV or to play, etc.), screaming at the child, threatening to punish the child, beating, name calling, etc.

(b) Child from a family with child neglect risks - any person under 18 years of age who lives in a household where s/he is sometimes left home alone or only with his or her siblings (without adult supervision).

DIMENSION 5. HOUSING

5.1. Child living in precarious conditions

A “Child living in precarious conditions” is a child dealing with one or several of the following situations/sub-vulnerabilities:

(a) Child living in an overcrowded home - any person under 18 years of age who lives in a household where the number of single persons exceeds the number of habitable rooms in the household.

(b) Child living in unsanitary conditions - any person under 18 years of age who lives in a household where there are problems such as roof leaks, damp walls, rotten/damaged windows/floors.

DIMENSION 6. FAMILY AND SOCIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

6.1. Child without an identity document

A “Child without an identity document” is any person under 18 years of age who does not have identity documents.

6.2. Child with one or both parents absent

A “Child with one or both parents absent” is a child dealing with one or several of the following situations/sub-vulnerabilities:

(a) Child with only one parent at home - any person under 18 years of age whose mother or father is a long-term patient in a hospital or nursing home/in prison/divorced, separated and moved out/deceased or with unknown circumstances.

(b) Child with migrant parents - any person under 18 years of age who has one or both parents working abroad.

(c) Child with both parents absent, but with an adult caregiver in the household - any person under 18 years of age, with both parents absent, who is looked after by an adult (older than 18 years). This does not apply to children in placement or foster care.

(d) Child without an adult caregiver in the household - any person under 18 years of age, with both parents absent, living in a household where the primary caregiver of children is under 18 years of age.

6.3. Child with disabilities

A "Child with disabilities" is any person under 18 years of age who has at least one disability.

6.4. Child separated from his or her family or at risk of separation

A "Child separated from his or her family or at risk of separation" is a child dealing with one or several of the following situations/sub-vulnerabilities:

(a) At-risk child in placement or foster care - any person under 18 years of age who is in placement or foster care and accumulates more than two vulnerabilities.

(b) Child at risk of being separated from his or her family - any person under 18 years of age who accumulates 7 or more vulnerabilities.

(c) Child at risk of being separated from his or her family - any person under 18 years of age whose mother has underage children who don't live in the household with her but are not in public care either.

(d) Child at risk of being separated from his or her family - any person under 18 years of age whose mother has underage children in public care.

V. AURORA-MANAGED AND MONITORED SERVICES FOR CHILDREN AND THEIR CAREGIVERS

SERVICES FROM A METHODOLOGICAL PERSPECTIVE

In terms of the services that vulnerable children and/or women can access, Aurora provides the community worker with a minimum intervention package. Services integrate basic social interventions, especially social assistance, and community nursing interventions and are grouped in the application under seven broad categories:



The minimum intervention package is individualised and adjusted to each case. With 257 possible interventions, Aurora creates the context for a vulnerable child or woman to benefit from at least this minimum package, which is merely a reference point for the work conducted by the social worker.

Aurora identifies the vulnerabilities of children and/or women in the household (through the questionnaire applied) while offering services to several household members: head of household, parents, children's caregiver, and children. The services addressed to adults are displayed under the person's name (even if the vulnerability was identified for a child in the household). In the case of adults, the application makes a "minimum targeting" of services, meaning that they are addressed to at least one adult household member.

1. IDENTIFICATION

A service carried out during questionnaire completion. It is not mentioned in the list of services as it is part of questionnaire application.

Vulnerable cases can be identified through a community census, referral by institutional actors, own-initiative action, request from the household, notification received from neighbours or through the snowball effect (by word of mouth) at village/commune level.

2. NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Questionnaire application is just a part of the needs assessment process. Aurora features several needs assessment services:

2.1 Standard social enquiry

Service description: It evaluates the social difficulties, needs and resources of the household.

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN1a - Child living in a household affected by income poverty

VULN1b - Child living in a household affected by extreme poverty

VULN10a - Child living in an overcrowded home

VULN10b - Child living in unsanitary conditions

VULN12a - Child with only one parent at home

VULN14b - Child at risk of being separated from his or her family - accumulating 7 or more vulnerabilities

VULN14c - Child at risk of being separated from his or her family - whose mother has underage children who don't live in the household but are not in public care

VULN14d - Child at risk of being separated from his or her family - whose mother has underage children in public care

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one home visit after case identification.

2.2 Checking and supplementing field data (a)

Service description: It evaluates the pregnant woman's health risks and health care needs based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN6a - Pregnant woman not registered with a family physician

VULN6b - Pregnant woman who hasn't benefited from prenatal consults

VULN6c - Unintended pregnancy

VULN8c - Underage mother or pregnant underage girl

Target beneficiaries: Pregnant woman, underage mother/pregnant underage girl.

Service frequency: The service is (re-)implemented during the pregnancy and postpartum monitoring consultations included in the minimum package.

2.3 Checking and supplementing field data (b)

Service description: It evaluates health risks and health care needs for children living in households with adults who suffer from chronic illnesses, based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN5b - Child living in a household with members suffering from chronic illness.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit to the family physician after case identification.

2.4 Checking and supplementing field data (c)

Service description: It evaluates drop-out causes based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN7f - Child who has dropped out.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one meeting with an informed teacher or the school counsellor working at the school where the child is/was enrolled.

2.5 Checking and supplementing field data (d)

Service description: It evaluates the causes of non-enrolment and/or non-participation in kindergarten/school based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN7a - Preschooler who is not enrolled in kindergarten

VULN7b - Child aged between 6 and 9 years who is not enrolled in school

VULN7c - Child aged between 10 and 15 years who is not enrolled in school

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one meeting with an informed teacher or the school counsellor working at the kindergarten/school located close to the household.

2.6 Checking and supplementing field data (e)

Service description: It evaluates difficulties stemming from child neglect. It also assesses health risks for the child at risk of being neglected. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN9b - Child from a family with child neglect risks.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit.

2.7 Checking and supplementing field data (f)

Service description: It evaluates difficulties stemming from the child's violent behaviour. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN8e - Child at risk of adopting violent behaviour.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit.

2.8 Checking and supplementing field data (g)

Service description: It evaluates difficulties stemming from violent behaviour. It also assesses health risks for children exposed to any form of violence. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the kindergarten, the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN8f - Child living in a household with violent behaviour risks.

VULN9a - Child from a family with child violence risks

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one meeting with the police officer from the community or the police department nearest to the household.

2.9 Checking and supplementing field data (h)

Service description: It evaluates health risks in terms of a healthy lifestyle. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN8a - Adolescent with risky behaviour in terms of a healthy lifestyle (diet and sports).

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit to the family physician after case identification.

2.10 Checking and supplementing field data (i)

Service description: It evaluates health risks and health care needs for the child with chronic illness. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN5a - Child with chronic illness.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit to the family physician after case identification.

2.11 Checking and supplementing field data (j)

Service description: It evaluates health risks and health care needs for the child under 1 year of age. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN3a - Low birth weight child

VULN3b - Unvaccinated child

VULN3c - Child who is not given Vitamin D and iron

VULN3d - Child under 6 months old who is not exclusively breastfed

VULN3e - Child over 6 months old whose diet is not diversified

VULN3f - Underdeveloped child

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit to the family physician after case identification.

2.12 Checking and supplementing field data (k)

Service description: It evaluates health risks and health care needs for children under 5. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN4a - Unvaccinated child

VULN4b - Child who is not given Vitamin D

VULN4c - Underdeveloped child

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit to the family physician after case identification.

2.13 Checking and supplementing field data (l)

Service description: It evaluates health risks for the child living in unsanitary conditions. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN10b - Child living in unsanitary conditions.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit.

2.14 Checking and supplementing field data (m)

Service description: It evaluates the risks due to lack of identity documents. It includes information about all family members without identity documents. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN11 - Child without an identity document (without a national identification number).

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit to the commune secretary after case identification.

2.15 Checking and supplementing field data (n)

Service description: It evaluates sexual risks. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN8b - Adolescent with risky sexual behaviour.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit.

2.16 Checking and supplementing field data (o)

Service description: It evaluates the drop-out risk and the need for support. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN7e - Child with special educational needs at risk of dropping out.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one meeting with an informed teacher or the school counsellor working at the school/kindergarten located close to the household.

2.17 Checking and supplementing field data (p)

Service description: It evaluates the drop-out risk. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN7d - Child at risk of dropping out.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one meeting with an informed teacher or the school counsellor working at the school/kindergarten located close to the household.

2.18 Checking and supplementing field data (q)

Service description: It evaluates health risks caused by substance use. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN8d - Adolescent with risky substance use behaviour.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one visit.

2.19 Checking and supplementing field data (r)

Service description: It evaluates social risks stemming from one or both parents' absence. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN12a - Child with only one parent at home

VULN12b - Child with migrant parents

VULN12c - Child with both parents absent, but with an adult caregiver in the household

VULN12d - Child without an adult caregiver in the household

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one meeting with an informed teacher, the school counsellor, the local doctor or another informed specialist who works in the community and is familiar with the household.

2.20 Checking and supplementing field data (s)

Service description: It evaluates social risks stemming from family placement (separation from the biological family, siblings). It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN14a - At-risk child in placement or foster care.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one meeting with an informed teacher, the school counsellor, the local doctor or another informed specialist who works in the community and is familiar with the household.

2.21 Checking and supplementing field data (t)

Service description: It evaluates social risks engendered by disability. It is based on discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN13 - Child with disabilities.

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one meeting with the local doctor or another informed specialist who works in the community and is familiar with the child's circumstances.

2.22 Checking and supplementing field data (u)

Service description: Discussions with other local stakeholders (e.g. the school, the doctor, the police, etc.).

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN1a - Child living in a household affected by income poverty

VULN1b - Child living in a household affected by extreme poverty

VULN2 - Child not registered with a family physician

VULN10a - Child living in an overcrowded home

VULN14b - Child at risk of being separated from his or her family - accumulating 7 or more vulnerabilities

VULN14c - Child at risk of being separated from his or her family - whose mother has underage children who don't live in the household but are not in public care

VULN14d - Child at risk of being separated from his or her family - whose mother has underage children in public care

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: The service is implemented during at least one meeting with an informed teacher, the school counsellor, the local doctor or another informed specialist who works in the community and is familiar with the household.

3. INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

3.1 Information about professional (re)integration steps

Service description: It provides information about the steps towards professional integration and/or reintegration. It is conducted either at the beneficiary's home or during individual or group meetings at SPAS offices/community centre.

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN1a - Child living in a household affected by income poverty

Target beneficiaries: The child's primary caregiver.

Service frequency: It is carried out during at least one meeting.

3.2 Information about the child's right to identity

Service description: It provides information about the child's right to identity. It is conducted either at the beneficiary's home or at SPAS offices/community centre.

Vulnerabilities requiring this service:

VULN11 - Child without an identity document (without a national identification number)

The community worker identifies service providers, community or county resources and takes the required steps with the client, helping him or her to prepare/draw up/obtain documents. S/he accompanies the parent/legal representative to different institutions in order to get the required documents and information and s/he mediates the relationship with other relevant institutions with a view to resolving the case.

6. REFERRAL

Referral services are provided when the solution to the case lies with another professional/institution or when community resources don't cover the client's needs. They are delivered after all the resources of the main service provider and all the local solutions have been exhausted. Cases of abuse and neglect are an exception. If the initial case evaluation finds that the child's physical, mental, spiritual, moral or social development is endangered, the public social assistance services must immediately inform the General Directorate for Social Assistance and Child Protection.

Where the case falls within the competence of a professional available in the community, the community worker will notify that professional (verbally, over the phone or in writing) about the client/family/household's situation or will help prepare and send the file to the relevant institutions/organisations.

8. RE-EVALUATION

Re-evaluation is conducted at least every 9 months during the intervention. The case is re-evaluated based on the questionnaire. Field data is checked and supplemented based on discussions with other local stakeholders like the school, the doctor, the police, etc.

9. ZERO PRIORITY SERVICE

The minimum intervention package includes a special service for children at risk of being removed from their families (who accumulate 7 or more vulnerabilities), called the zero priority service.

For the delivery of the zero priority service, the community worker contacts the DGASPC to validate and supplement/adjust (where applicable) the list of services. The list of services is validated with a view to finalising the individual service plan. The individual service plan is implemented with the support of the other professionals at community and/or county levels.

The zero priority service takes precedence over other services.
