

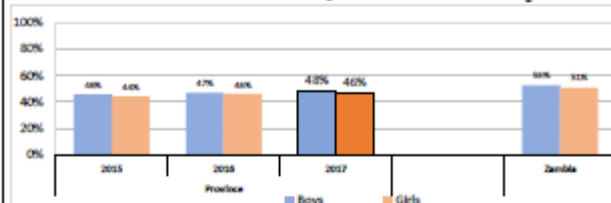

Learning outcomes: Grade 7 - Percentage of learners achieving Division 1, 2 or 3

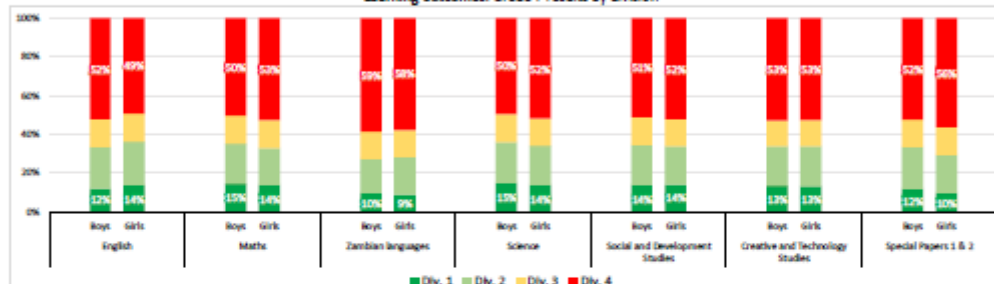


Congratulations! Overall results have improved from 2016 and 2015.

Your Province's results are similar to the national average.

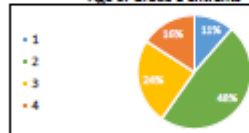
Learning outcomes: Grade 7 results by division



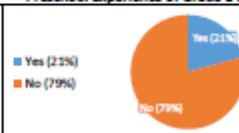
ENGLISH: 12% of boys and 14% of girls achieved Division 1 and 52% of boys and 49% of girls failed.  
MATHEMATICS: 15% of boys and 14% of girls achieved Division 1 and 50% of boys and 53% of girls failed.  
ZAMBIAN LANGUAGES: 10% of boys and 9% of girls achieved Division 1 and 59% of boys and 58% of girls failed.  
SCIENCE: 15% of boys and 14% of girls achieved Division 1 and 50% of boys and 52% of girls failed.  
SDS: 14% of boys and 14% of girls achieved Division 1 and 51% of boys and 52% of girls failed.

46% of new entrants were 7 years old, 24% were 8 years old, 16% were older than 8.

Only 21% had preschool experience before entering Grade 1.

Orphans are the largest group of vulnerable children and represent 13% of all boys and 13% of girls (13% of all pupils).

Promotion rates greater than 100% indicate that there were new pupils who entered that grade (transfers or children returning to school after dropping out).

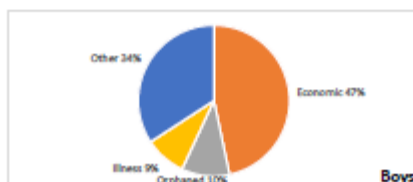
Grade 7 has the highest percentage of repeaters (7%).

Grade 7 has the highest number of reported dropouts (1050).

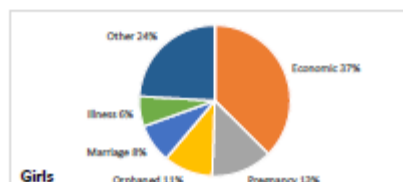
The lowest promotion rate is between Grade 6 and Grade 7 (89%).

The lowest promotion rate for boys is between Grade 6 and Grade 7 (93%).

The lowest promotion rate for girls is between Grade 6 and Grade 7 (84%).

The main reasons for boys dropping of school were: Economic, Orphaned, Illness, and Other.  
The main reasons for girls dropping of school were: Economic, Pregnancy, Orphaned, and Marriage.
