



ENGLISH: 12% of boys and 14% of girls achieved Division 1 and 52% of boys and 49% of girls falled. MATHEMATICS: 15% of boys and 14% of girls achieved Division 1 and 50% of boys and 53% of girls failed. ZAMBIAN LANGUAGES: 10% of boys and 9% of girls achieved Division 1 and 59% of boys and 58% of girls failed. SCIENCE: 15% of boys and 14% of girls achieved Division 1 and 50% of boys and 52% of girls failed. SDS: 14% of boys and 14% of girls achieved Division 1 and 51% of boys and 52% of girls failed.


