**8. Evaluation reports and management responses**

**Formative evaluation of the Out-of-School Children Initiative, and management response**

*For decision (E/ICEF/2019/3, E/ICEF/2019/4)*

A partnership between UNICEF, the Institute for Statistics of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization and the Global Partnership for Education, the Out-of-School Children Initiative was launched in 2010 to support Governments to develop and apply innovative approaches to estimate the number of children excluded from school, develop profiles of excluded children and implement programmes to enable school participation for all children. The evaluation found that

the initiative was successful in situating the relevant issues at the centre of the development agenda and increasing commitment to them. However, resources were not allocated on a sustainable basis and the commitment of partners to the initiative's rights-based model was not always clear. The evaluation provides a number of recommendations for improving the measurement and promotion of school participation.
