What is the situation?



Only 1 in 3 infants, under the age of 6 months, are exclusively breastfed (about 30%)²



1 in 3 children under the age of 5 are anemic (33%)²



Only 1 in 10 young children, **aged 6-23 months**, fed with adequate and nutritionally diverse diets ¹





b per cent childhood wasting - doubled in 2022 from 2019 ¹

What are our priorities?

- Prevention of malnutrition by focusing on the first 1,000 days of life and delivering evidence-based maternal and child nutrition interventions.
- Early detection through referrals and treatment of childhood wasting.
- Strengthening the national nutrition information system and capacity at local and community level for service delivery.
- Multi-sectoral nutrition response to deliver intersectoral interventions to address underlying determinants of access to food, services, and adoption of optimum practices.

What are we doing?

Protecting, promoting, and supporting optimal breastfeeding practices, as well as the use of age-appropriate complementary foods during the first 1,000 days of life.

Generating evidence through assessments and surveys (SMART 2023)



Increasing capacity of front-line workers on skilled maternal nutrition counselling and care during pregnancy and lactation period.



Strengthening nutrition surveillance and inter-sectoral linkages with other sectors.

What are our targets for 2023?



2 million children and pregnant and lactating women receiving micronutrients



256,000 children 6-59 months receiving vitamin A supplementation

1.9 million children 6-59 months screened for wasting



1.6 million

primary caregivers of children 0-23 months receiving infant and young child feeding counselling

What are the gaps?

The lack of sustainable, long-term funding impacts negatively prevention work and delivery of nutrition supplies for treatment. Lack of investments in long-term system building efforts that address stunting.
