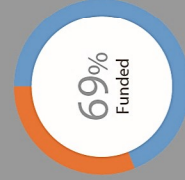

SITUATION ANALYSIS

- During 2017, access to safe water remained to be limited for much of the population, with increased water quality assurances necessary to ensure the population had continuous access to safe water.
- Alternate water supply services and WASH supplies are available but relatively expensive, that pushed vulnerable families to adopt unsafe coping strategies.
- People in besieged areas and newly accessible areas lacked sufficient access to critical WASH services and critical WASH supplies.

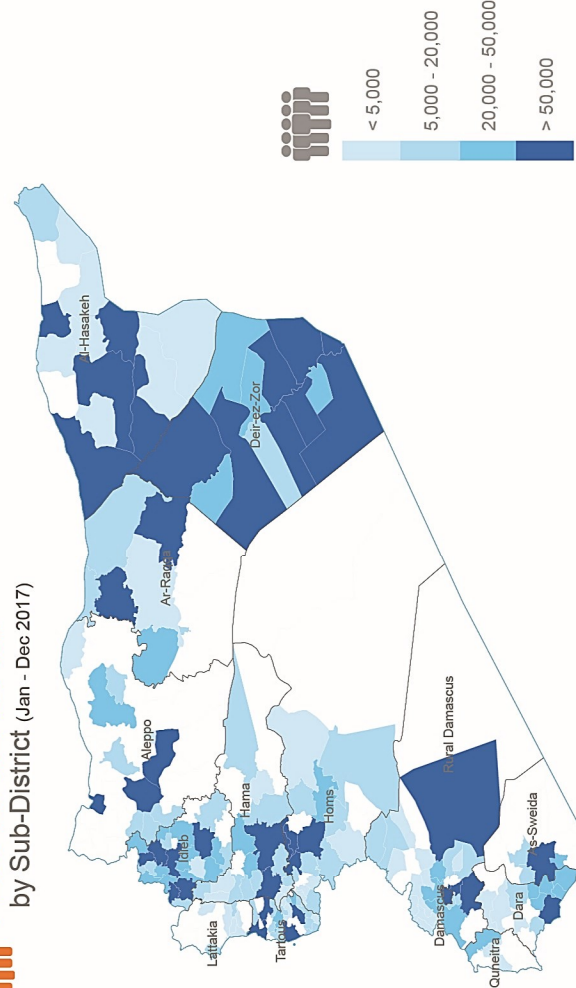

1. Estimated number of people served by support to repair/rehabilitation/augmentation of water and sanitation systems	5.9 m	4.9 m	121%
2. Estimated number of people served by support to operation and maintenance of water and sanitation systems	14.6 m	12.3 m	119%
3. Number of people supported with access to essential WASH NFIs, including in besieged, military encircled and hard to reach areas	2.1 m	1.7 m	125%

5. Number of school children benefitting from improved WASH facilities and services	383,000	250,000	153%

RECENT HIGHLIGHTS

- As a direct result of investments in clean water, hygiene, and sanitation, there were no major disease outbreaks or water borne diseases in 2017.
- UNICEF's support to the provision of over 6,000 metric tons of water disinfectant supported over 14 million people to have access to clean water every month.
- UNICEF improved access to clean water and sanitation for children in northern Syria by investing in the rehabilitation of water systems.
