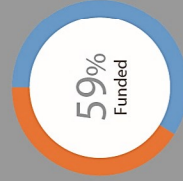

SITUATION ANALYSIS

- Non-food item assistance remained substantial, both in terms of life-saving needs, particularly those among the high numbers of newly displaced IDPs requiring core, supplementary and seasonal assistance; as well as longer-term needs, among those communities requiring resilience-oriented support to help meet these needs.
- In 2017, economic pressures were key drivers of need, with large population groups stating that the most widespread challenges are inability to afford rent and to afford needed non-food items.

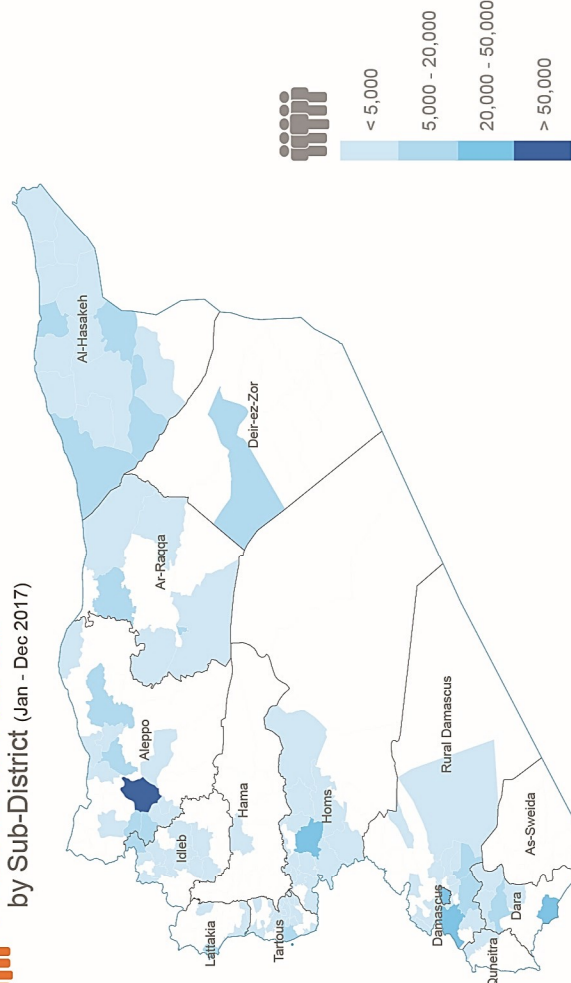


2 Number of children benefitting from e-vouchers (summer and/or winter)

RECENT HIGHLIGHTS

- As part of UNICEF's seasonal response, 481,000 children were protected against harsh weather conditions with clothing kits and blankets, including 167,000 children living in HTR and besieged areas.
- The use of e-vouchers for the direct purchase of clothes was scaled-up to reach some 52,000 children in Homs, Tartous, Latakia, Quamishli and Damascus.
