

VIOLENCE AGAINST CHILDREN in VIET NAM

Almost **68.4 PER CENT** of children aged 1-14 reported as experiencing some form of violence at home by their parents, caregivers.¹

Around **20 PER CENT** of girls and boys aged eight reported being physically punished in school.²

Around 16 per cent or **1.7 MILLION** children aged 5-17 are considered as child labourers of which 7.8 per cent perform work in hazardous conditions.³

The number of girls and young women aged between 15 and 19 who are married increased **TWOFOLD**, from 5.4 per cent in 2006 to 11 per cent in 2015.¹

5,300 cases of **CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE**, primarily against girls, were reported between 2011 and 2015.⁴
